Blessed be god in primer I give my Body to the earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of its Resurrection from thence at the last day as for my several pieces it may be used without pomp or State as for the direction of my Executors hereafter Named who I doubt not will manage it with all prudent Providence as to my worldly Estate I will and positively Order that all my Debts be paid. Item I Give to my Loving Sister Elizabeth and my Brother in law William When my Plantation Lying in Augusta County and Joining John Lunsingham and a Part of land of James Kincaid's my other Plantation on Hope Creek in Bath County I give to be Equally divided Between my Brother Alexander Clark and my Sister Ann Smith and my Sister Margaret Kincaid and James Kincaid and I Give for good John Lockridge what he owes me and likewise I Give John When what he owes me and I Give my Broad Cloth Coat to William When Junior and my new Jacket I Give to my Brother Alexander Clark and I forgive William When the Remainder of the Bond that stand on him for money and all and the Remission of my Estate after payment of my Debt to be Equally divided Between William When Alexander Clark John Seabolt Samuel Kincaid and my Bed and Bed Clothes I Give to my Brother William and my daughter Elizabeth and as consisted William and John When Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have

Named in & will Refuse to join in the Executesthip thereof
