waters of the sum of one thousand seven hundred and twenty two
Dollars and fifty cents lawful currency of Virginia to me here
paid by Elizabeth Sneed of the County and State aforesaid the
Receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained sold
and delivered and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver
in unto the said Elizabeth Sneed the following property to wit
one Negro man slave known by the name of Jack at the sum
of four hundred Dollars one Negro woman slave known by the name
of Patted at the sum of four hundred Dollars one Negro girl
slave known by the name of Milly at the sum of two hundred and
fifty Dollars one Negro Boy slave known by the name of Daniel
at the sum of two hundred Dollars one Negro slave known by
the name of Lourdais at the sum of one hundred and fifty Dollars
two horses at the sum of seventy five Dollars each three feathered hens
and partridge at the sum of one hundred Dollars twelve head of
sheep at the sum of Twenty Dollars three cows at the sum of
Thirty Dollars three young cattle at the sum of fifteen Dollars
one large Iron Kettle at the sum of Four Dollars one Iron
pot at the sum of three Dollars and one Dutch Oven at the sum
of one Dollar and fifty cents amounting in the whole to one
thousand seven hundred and twenty three Dollars and fifty
cents To have and to hold the said bargained premises
unto the said Elizabeth Sneed her heirs Executors administrators

in Assignee power And I the said Richard Sneed for myself my
heirs Executors and administrators shall and will warrant and defend
against all persons or persons by their presents the aforesaid bargain
ed premises unto the said Elizabeth Sneed her heirs Executors admin-
istrators in Assignee power In Witness whereof the said Richard
Sneed have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the fifteenth
day of February in the year one thousand Eight Hundred and nine and
in the thirty third year of the Commonwealth

In the name of God Amen. I James Graham of
Bath County and state of Virginia being weak in body by
of sound & perfect mind & memory do make this my last
will & Testament in the presence of my friends following viz

In the first place I commend my soul to God who governs
and my body to the dust to be buried in a decent manner
In the next place I will & direct that my beloved wife Jane
Graham have the use of my plantation in which I now live
for the support of the family until My son David arrives
to the age of twenty one year and the profits of said plantation
over & above what is necessary for the support of the family
to be kept with the other monies arising from the Estate for
distribution in the manner hereafter to be mentioned

I then I will & direct that my wife Jane have the use
of all my Negroes if she thinks proper to keep them. If not
she is at liberty to sell them for the benefit of the Legatee
and if they are not sold when my son David comes of age
the Legatee may either sell them or divide them among
themselves as they can best agree as part of their respective
Legacies I then I will & direct that my wife Jane have

the said bed of my horses with the Waggons and gears, tany
my cattle of her own blood and also my sheep & hogs for the
use of the family; and the rest of my horses & cows to be sold
I will & bequeath to my son James My silver
watch and set of Silver Tea spoons & my silver Kneebuckles
lastly I will & direct that all other goods & Chatter of any
kind of which I am possessed be kept by my wife Sam-
uel for the use of the family until my son David comes to
lawful age and then to be sold I will & direct that my
land be then sold and the monies arising therefrom, as also
all the monies arising from the aforesaid profits & sales
to be divided in the manner following Viz to my son David
I will & bequeath one hundred pounds to my son James
seventy five pounds and ^{the} residue to be equally divided between
My beloved wife Jane Graham. My Daughters Sally and my
two sons James & David and if any of the Legals should
think proper to call for any monies prior to this time
it is to be considered as part of their whole distribution is
made I do hereby appoint my well beloved wife Jane
Graham and my son James to execute this my last will
& testament Two Witnesses whom I have hereunto set my
hand & seal this fifteenth day of June in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine
signed by sealed in the
