As follows I leave to my son Hugh M'Kee one hundred Dollars a year since his Fathers death including three hundred Dollars he has received in Money and Oats one Mare & cat shewing their Cote his gun and shot Bag his bed & furniture. I likewise leave to my Daughter Polly one Bed & furniture one Mule bow & arrow & knife

one Mare her Saddle & Bridle her Spinning Wheel four head of Sheep. - I leave to my Daughter Isabella her bed & Furniture her Spinning Wheel her Saddle & Bridle. I leave to my Daughter Nancy one bed & Furniture her Saddle & Bridle & Spinning Wheel the remainder of my Estate I allow to be sold at publick Sale and equally divided into three parts my son Joseph M'Kee to have one third and my son James M'Kee to have the second part and third part to be equally divided amongst all my sons & Daughters above named after all expenses & just debts is paid out of the same. I do hereby appoint Thomas Reed, Charles Fawcett & William Bratton to be my Executors as witnesses my hand and seal this 5th day of December one thousand eight hundred & twenty 1820
