The Condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above bound James Talman is appointed by the county Court of Bath Guardian of Allen Dumas alias, Damselberry an Orphan Child and of the said James Talman shall secure the estate of the said Child and indemnify the Court there the above Obligation to be void else to remain in full force.

In the name of God Amen I Jane Mann of the county of Bath Widow being weak and sick of Body but of perfect mind and memory to make this my last will and Testament in manner and form following - I give and bequeath my Soul to God who give it and my Body to the Earth thereto be buried in a decent Christian like manner by my Executors herein after named Nothing doubting to receive it again at the resurrection through the merits of Christ my redemption and as touching such worldly estate of which I am possessed I devise the same as follows - Item I give and bequeath to my Son John Mann my negro woman Jane and her Child Jane during the natural life time of him the said John Mann then at his death the said Negro Jane together with her future increase from this Time of any she has and Jane to be equally divided between my three Daughters herein after named. Also I give and bequeath to my said son John my two Muttule Slaves to wit Rachel and George until they severally attain the age of twenty one Years respectively at which time my will and desire is that they be set free and emancipated from the service of the said John or any other person together with the increase of the said Rachel if any she has. Likewise I give and bequeath to my said Son John all my Stock of Sheep and Hogs all the furniture in and about the house save your good Beds and the furniture of them thereto be lying. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Alice the Wife of Alex. H. Cavendish and the heirs of her own Body my Negro Girl named Fanny Jane. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Jane the wife of Robert M. Clarke my negro Girl named Annica Jane. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah the wife of Alex. M. Clarke my negro Girl

named Sarah forever also two Feather Beds with the furniture of our
 known by my Bed also my Grey Mare. Item I give and bequeath to
 my Son Moses Maud one Bond executed by him to me for the sum of
 ten pounds and one other Bond due me from the estate of my son
 Archibald Maud. Do for the sum of three pounds which Bonds I
 give to him in lieu of what articles I purchased at the sale of the Estate
 of the said Archibald and if the said Moses will not accept these
 of as compensation therefor then I will that the said Bonds may
 be applied so far as they may go towards what I may owe said Estate.
 Item I will that my son John pay unto my executor the sum of
 sixty three Dollars which I owe him towards paying for the price
 of his Negro Slave George also forty Bushels of Corn due to me
 by said John. Item I will that my Executor sell my two
 Cows four head of Cows and the forty Bushels of Corn above men-
 tioned and the money arising from the sale thereof together with
 the sixty three Dollars aforesaid to be equally divided between
 my three Daughters above named. Item I give unto my aforesaid
 Daughters all my wearing Apparel to be equally divided be-
 tween them. Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Moses
 Maud my part or Share of any thing that may be coming to me
 from the Estate of Archibald Hamilton dec'd either real or personal
 given. Item I give and bequeath to my son John all and every
 such parts of my Estate as are not comprised in the bequests before
 mentioned. Lastly I appoint my son in Law Alexander McWhirter
 to my sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and I do
 hereby revoke any will or wills by me heretofore made. In Wit-
 ness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 26th
 day of August 1813
