Sloan the third of all my Personal Estate that I am possessed of Likewise
the whole to my youngest son Andrew Sloan Comes of age. Likewise I leave
it to my Executors to Give as the See Cause to my Children as the Many
as Much of my Estate as will be Equal to Give to Each and that the
Executors May Give my Land to what so ever Child the will think
Worthy of it when the Youngest Comes of age. I do leave to my
son William Sloan the money which he now Claims with
a Saddle and Bridle when he comes of age over and above
what the Debt will Get I do appoint that Each of my
Children Get what is Equal when the come of age of the
said Estate Given under my hand and Seal with
the Consent of my wife this seventh day of October 1789
I do appoint Jennet Sloan and John McClellong Executors of
this my last will -

Clung and Jennet Stone John Oliver and Nathan Crawford are held and jointly bound unto Samuel Leane John Wilson John Butler John Bean Samuel Shreve - Juny James Robinson William Crawford & Peter Tillington Gentlemen Justices of the Court of Bath County New Selling in the sum of one thousand pounds to the payment whereof we and truly to be made to the said Justices and their Successors we bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our Heirs Executors and Admrs. jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 15th day of Feb^y one thousand seven hundred and ninety two and in the 16th year of the Commonwealth -

The Condition of this Obligation is that if the said John M. Clung & Jennet Stone Executors of the Last will and Testament with the Will annexed of all the Goods Chattles and Credits of James Stone Dec^d do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattles and credits of the said Dec^d which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of them the said John M. Clung & Jennet Stone Ex^{rs} into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for them and the same so made or exhibited into the county court of Bath County at such time as they shall be therunto Required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattles and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law and make a just and true account of their doings and receipts therein when thereto Required by the said Court and do further do well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said Will as far as the said Goods Chattles and Credits will Extend according to the Value thereof and as the Law shall Charge them then this Obligation to be void or Else to Remain in full force sealed and delivered in presence of -
