like Manner as my Executors hereafter mentioned shall think fit Next that  
all my funeral charges may be discharged together with all my legal  
debts which I have contracted that I leave to my well beloved wife Jannet  
Sloan the third of all my personal Estate that I am possessed of likewise  
the whole to my youngest son Andrew Sloan comes of age likewise I leave  
it to my Executors to give as the See cause to my Children as the Many  
as much of my Estate as will be equal to give to each and that the  
Executors may give my land to what so ever Child they will think  
Worthy of it when the youngest comes of age. I do leave to my  
son William Sloan the more which he now claims with  
a saddle and Bridle when he comes of age over and above  
what the rest will get I do appoint that Each of my  
Children gets what is equal when the come of age of the  
said Estate Given under my hand and Seal with  
the consent of my wife this seventh day of October 1789  
I do appoint Jannet Sloan and John M. Elong Executors of  
this my last will -




This last will and testament of James Sloan late I was proved by

I KNOW all men by these presents that we John M. Coling and Jannet  
Stone. John Oliver and Nathan Crawford are here under jointy bound  
unto Samuel Stone John Wilson John Barker John Bear Samuel Shreve-  
Henry James Robinson William Crawford & Robert Titterington Gentleman  
Justices of the Court of Bath County New settling in the sum of one thousand  
Pounds to the payment whereof will and Party to be made to the said  
Justices and their Successors are bind ourselves and each of us our  
and Each of our Heirs Executors and Administrators jointly and severally  
jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this 11th  
day of February one thousand seven hundred and thirty two and in  
the 16th year of the Commonwealth —

The Condition of this Obligation is that if the Said John M. Coling  
& Jannet Stone Executors of the last will and Testament with the will  
Annexed of all the Goods Chattels and Credits of James Stone Esq<sup>r</sup> do  
make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels  
and credits of the said Esq<sup>r</sup> which have or shall come to the hands  
before him in knowledge of them the said John M. Coling & Jannet  
Stone Esq<sup>r</sup> or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons  
for them and the same so made be exhibited in the county court of  
such time as they shall be demanded Required by the said court  
and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly examine  
to ascertain value and make a just and true account of their  
settlement and clearing wherein when there shall be Required by the said court  
a further do well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies  
contained and specified in the said will as far as the said  
Goods Chattels and Credits will extend according to the value  
thereof and as the same shall charge them then this obligation  
to be void or else to remain in full force
