 and testament in manner following (to wit) 1st It is my
 will that my Executors pay all my just Debts as soon as the nature
 of the case will admit 2^d I will and bequeath to my Son
 William Slown Sixty Six Dollars and Sixty six Cents to
 him and his heirs forever 3^d I will and bequeath to my
 Daughter Margaret who intermarried with ^{James} Kelly Sixty Six Dollars
 and Sixty six Cents also all my wearing apparel to her and her heirs
 for ever 4th I will and bequeath to my Son James Slown Sixty
 Six Dollars and Sixty six Cents to him and his heirs forever
 5th I will and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Slown Eleven head of
 Horned Cattle also eighteen Dollars Cash to enable her to purchase
 a Saddle also one half of my household and Kitchen furniture
 also one half of my flock of Sheep also one half of all debts
 dues and demands that may be coming to me after the payment
 of my just Debts and the above mentioned legacies to her
 and her heirs for ever 6th I will and bequeath to my Son
 John Slown my Bay Mare and Colt also one equal half of my
 my flock of Sheep also one equal half of my household and Kitchen
 furniture: also one equal half of all my just claims that
 are now due or that may hereafter become due to him and
 his heirs forever. 7th And lastly I do hereby constitute and
 appoint my Son John Slown & William Sillington Esquire
 Executors of This my last Will and testament in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this

sealed with our seals and dated this 11th day of September 1821
The condition of the above Obligation is such that if the said
Charles L Francisco Clerk of Bath County shall
faithfully account for and pay into the Treasury of the
Commonwealth all taxes on Law process ordinary fines
and other public Monies which shall come into his
hands as Clerk of said County for the ensuing year ending
on the 1st day of September ^{the} year 1822 at the time and
in the manner prescribed ^{and} ~~and~~ by Law
then the above Obligation to be void else to remain in
full force.
