here and firmly bound unto James Monroe Esq^r Governor
of Virginia and his successors for the use of the Com-
monwealth in the sum of Thirty thousand dollars to
which payment well and truly to be made we bind
ourselves our heirs ~~law~~ and executors and successors
firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and
dated this 11th day of August 1801.

The condition of the above obligation is such
that whereas the above bound William Crawford
is constituted and appointed sheriff of Bath County
by Commission from James Monroe Governor of the
Commonwealth of Virginia bearing date the 29th
day of June and 26th year of the Commonwealth
if therefore the said William Crawford shall true
and faithfully collect and account for and pay
the amount of the public taxes imposed by law
within the said County of Bath for the year 1800
as the law directs then the above obligation to
be void else to remain in full force.

1793 I John Bowler of Bath County State of Virginia
being frail of body but of good and sound memory
do make my last will and Testament in manner
shewing to Almighty God and calling to mind
the uncertain state of this transitory life and that
all flesh must yield to death wherefore I do
call to God to witness and declare this my
last will and testament in manner and form fol-
lowing. Reciting and reciting by these presents
all and every instrument or instruments will or wills
herefore by me made and dictated either by word
or writing and this to be taken only for my last
will and testament and first being present and
saying from the bottom of my heart for my sins
past most humbly desire forgiveness for the same
I give and commit my soul to Almighty God my
Saviour and Redeemer in whom and by the merits
of Jesus Christ I believe to be saved and have full
remission of all my sins and that my soul with my
body at the general Resurrection will rise again with
joy through the merits of Christ's death and passion
and inherit the kingdom of heaven prepared for
him both by his active and passive obedience; and
first after my death I recommend my body to be buried
in such place as shall please my Executor or Executors
hereafter named to appoint and for settling of my worldly
Estate that it hath pleased God to bestow on
me I do order and dispose of them in manner and
form following. Item and first I will and desire that
all my just debts should be faithfully and fully dis-
charged within a convenient time by my executor here-
after named Item I leave and bequeath to my dearly
beloved wife Mary Baxter the full benefit of all
my real and personal Estate for her comfort and
support during her natural life Item I leave and
bequeath to my Grand son John Baxter after my
decease also my lands one negro man named
Bob and all the farming utensils together with
all the Cospow & lawn tools likewise the two horses
that are now named to him and their increase

with the rifle gun that was his fathers and my watch
with two Cows & two Birds and bedding to him and his
heirs forever. Item I leave to my grand daughter
Mary Parker one negro woman named Bel and
child named Ben one mare and saddle two Cows
and two Birds and bedding with all their increase
to her and her heirs forever. Item I leave Samuel
Vance son & George Harper my executors who are
hurly enabled to collect discharge and finally carry
into execution at my decease this my last will
and Testament signed and Seal'd the day and
year above written

No. 47. It is not convenient for both the above named executors to act, the other is to have the same power as both now have, and all necessary expenses is to be disbursed out of the exec. fund.

No. My Grand Son John Baxter is to have my desk and his Sister Mary is to have my Chest and all my books is to be equally divided between them previous to Mary Harper getting any part and then the whole to be executed as above.

 due to me in anywise when collected be equally
 divided in the manner following that is to say to my
 son Joseph McClinton one part of the amount of such
 money to my son Robert one part to my son Alex-
 ander one part and to my daughter Margaret Mor-
 ris one part and to my daughter Nancy McClinton
 one part except the amount of a bond taken from
 her and not on stamp paper for forty pounds and
 to the children of Thomas McClinton which he has
 had by my daughter Jane now deceased I will
 one part of the amount of the sales & before mentioned
 to be equally divided between them and to be paid
 by my executors hereafter named, as the said children
 of my daughter Jane shall be of age or many and
 the before mentioned parts being six in number be
 for the before mentioned children & grand children,
 for them their heirs or assigns forever, and as its
 my wife desire that my wife woman bel and
 her children should not be parted I desire and will
 that they be all sole together. It is my will and I
 do hereby appoint my son Alexander McClinton and
 William Morris Executors of this my last will and
 Testament revoking all others wills heretofore made by
