I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following that is to say 1st I leave the whole my just dues and personal expenses to be punctually paid 2^d I give and bequeath to my son Robert Carlile an account Decease from my said son Robert Carlile to the amount of thirty eight pounds out of which I intend to have my mountain and During my natural life and my personal expenses paid. 3^d I give and bequeath to my two grandsons John Carlile and Samuel Carlile sons of Samuel Carlile Deceased Six hundred Acres of land lying in Buchanan County Virginia to be equally divided and each to have an Equal part of said land to them forever I also give to my said grandsons John and Samuel Carlile Eighty five pounds each out of a bond of one hundred and twenty pounds due me from my son Robert Carlile bearing date Seventeen hundred and ninety nine of a proportionable part of the interest I also give to my two grandsons above mentioned a note of twenty four pounds nine Shillings and nine pence due me from my said Robert Carlile bearing Date the seventeenth day of April Seventeen hundred and ninety nine with the interest from the date 4th I give and bequeath to my two grand Daughters Elizabeth Carlile and Rachel Carlile Daughters of the above mentioned Samuel Carlile Deceased twenty five pounds each out of the above mentioned bond of two hundred and twenty one pounds to receive at which the Marriage come of age of the proportionable part of the interest 5th I give and bequeath to my grandsons Samuel Carlile and John Carlile a note of twenty six pounds due me from John Carlile and Robert Carlile Sen^r bearing Date the seventeenth day of March Seventeen hundred and ninety seven to be given to my said grandsons the price of my house that now possesses my Deceased 6th I give and bequeath to the heirs of James Carlile Deceased one Dollar 7th I give and bequeath to Patrick Miller and Dollard 8th I give and bequeath to David Green and Dollard the above mentioned
