This Inventory and appraisement of the estate of Charles Bonaventure deceased with a list of property in Partnership with said Bonaventure and Andrew Collins was returned to court and ordered to be Recorded

Tested Charles Barnard et al

In the name of God Amen I say the second one thousand eight hundred and one I John Kirkhead of Bath County and State of Virginia being indisposed in body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all men once to die do make Constitute and Ordain this my last will and Testament to the world in words and manner following and first of all I commit my Soul to a mighty God who gave it and my body to be Buried <sup>at the</sup> desecration of my Execution hereafter named item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Elizabeth all my moveable property consisting of Negros, horses, cattle, Sheep, and hogs and household furniture and Plantation Intencials to be

to her use and at her disposal and her living on  
my lands during her natural life I will and  
bequeath unto my four sons Andrew, John, Rob-  
ert and James five Dollars each together with  
what they have already got to be their share of  
my Estate also to my Daughter Isabell who mar-  
ried Thomas Kinkead five Dollars together with  
what she has already got to be her share of my Es-  
tate item I will and bequeath unto my son Will-  
iam 332 Acres of land in the State of Kentucky in  
Fayette County on Eagle Creek to him and his  
heirs item I will and bequeath unto my son David  
all that part of land <sup>the</sup> I now live on above a Run  
known by the name of the Lick Run on the North  
East of my Survey and from the mouth of sd Run  
a straight course to the Bull pasture mountain  
to him and his heirs item I will and bequeath un-  
to my son Ferdinand all that part of my Survey  
lying below a Run known by the name of the lit-  
tle Draft Run with a straight line to Bull pasture  
mountain with all the lands lying on any stream  
running into sd Run being on the south side of  
my Survey to him and his heirs item I will and  
bequeath unto my son Charles L all the remain-  
der of my sd Lands lying and being between the above  
mentioned Runs with the Improvements thereon  
to him and his heirs also it is my will that my son  
Isaac have his living on my lands during his na-  
tural life and I do hereby nominate constable and  
appoint my son David Elizabeth my wife and  
John Lewis the whole & sole Executors of this my last  
Will and Testament in witness whereof I have here-  
unto set my hand & Seal the date above  
Signed, sealed, and acknowledged Jno Kinkead (Seal)  
before us

State being of sound and disposing mind and me-  
mory do make and appoint this as my last will  
and Testament first I bequeath my soul to God who  
gave and my Body to the Earth looking for a reuni-  
on at the General restoration of all things - as to  
such worldly Goods as I am posses'd of I will them  
in the following manner To wit Tis my will that  
my negro Sally live on the place where I now live  
with my son Charles L in order to attend to my  
son Isaac Tis my will to give and bequeath to my  
son Ferdinand and his Heirs &c negro Jack son of the  
afore named Sally Tis my will to give and bequeath  
to my son David and his Heirs &c my negro Woman  
Lucy - Tis my will to give and bequeath to my  
son Charles L Kinkead my negro Girl Elsie which  
negro Girl Elsie is at this time in possession of sd  
Charles L Tis my will to give and bequeath to my  
Daughter Isabell during her natural life my  
Negro Girl Milly and after her decease to become  
the property of Betsey Kinkead daughter of the a-  
fore Isabell - Tis my will to give and bequeath to my  
son Charles & his heirs &c my negro boy Harry
