 and dated this 9th day of June 1819.

The Condition of the above Obligation is

 hath been appointed a constable in this county
 agreeably to an act of assembly concerning con-
 stableries of this said Samuel Woods shall
 well and truly discharge the duties of his said
 Office of constable agreeable to the said act of
 assembly then the above Obligation to be void else
 to remain in full force.

 her own free use and the other part of my personal pro-
 perty my will is, my two meads six head of Cattle six
 head of Sheep and all my Hogs, also all the Grain
 now in the farm and all the farming Utensils should
 be left on the farm at the disposal of my wife Hannah
 for the Support and bringing up of my Children. I also
 give and bequeath my Rifle Gun unto my oldest
 son William Knox, and my two steel traps me to John
 my second son the other to William my third son also
 the appraised property to be left on the farm and not
 be sold at sale and the Rest of my personal property to
 be sold by my executor herein after to be mentioned
 the proceeds of which to be divided between my three
 sons after the payment of all my just debts, my
 will concerning my real estate is that my wife Han-
 nah shall have free and sole use of it during her
 natural life for the purpose of her support and the
 schooling and support of my three sons, but in case
 of her marrying or in case of her death my will is
 that my under named Executors shall have the
 whole and sole control of my land and the personal
 property mentioned for the support of my three sons, or
 my Executors shall think most proper for their Relief
 and when my three sons William, John, and William
 when they ^{shall} come of age my will is that all my estate
 personal and real shall be divided equally between
 them and to be for their sole use forever, and I do

she lives and after her decease I devise that

and personal if my son William comes back
and lives in my Land he shall have one half
and does at the lower end if not Samuel is
to pay him Fifty Dollars it is my will that
Samuel shall pay his brother John one hundred
dollars out of my Estate it is my will that
Samuel shall pay to my daughters Martha
Prain, Spable, Nicholas Elizabeth Thoms, Mar-
garet Richardson one Dollar each I devise
that my daughter Elizabeth shall have her
wedding and House as long as she stands
in need of it my will is that my son Samuel
shall be my Executor the fifth day of October 1818
