perty my wife is my two horses her herd of cattle six  
head of sheep and all my dogs, also all the land  
now in the farm and all the farming Utencials should  
be left on the farm at the disposal of my wife Hannah  
for the support and bringing up of my children, also  
give and Bequeath my Rifle Gun unto my oldest  
son William Woods, and my two Steel traps and to John  
my second son the other to Wilson my third son all  
the afferaid property to be left on the farm and not  
be sold at sale and the rest of my Personal property to  
be sold by my executors herein after to be mentioned  
the proceeds of which to be divided between my three  
sons after the payment of all my just debts, my  
will concerning my real estate is that my wife Han-  
nah shall have free and sole use of it during her  
natural life for the purpose of her support and the  
education and support of my three sons but in case  
of her marrying or in case of her death my wife is  
that my under named Executrix shall have the  
whole and sole control of my lands and the personal  
property mentioned for the support of my three sons as  
my Executrix shall think most proper for their relief  
and when my three sons William, John and Wilson  
when they come of age my will is that all my estate  
Personal and Real shall be divided equally between
