Jacob Warick John Dean & James Graham are held and firmly
bound unto James Wood Esquire Governor of Virginia and his
Successors for the sum being in the sum of One thousand
Dollars which payment well and truly to be made we bind
ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and
severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals
and Dated this 11th day of May 1799.

The condition of the above obligation is such that
whereas the above bound John Brown is constituted and appointed
Sheriff of the county of ^{Wash} commission from the Governor
under the seal of the commonwealth dated the 17th day of
April last past, if therefore the said John Brown shall
well and truly collect and receive all officers fees and dues
paid into his hands to collect and duly account for and
pay the same to the officers to whom such fees are due
respectively at such times as are prescribed and limited by
law, and shall well and truly execute and due return
make, of all process and precepts, to him directed, and pay
and satisfy all sums of money and Tobacco by him received
by virtue of any such process, to the person or persons to
whom the same are due, his or their executors administrators
or assigns and in all other things shall truly and faith-
fully execute and perform the said office of Sheriff
during the time of his continuance therein, then the above
obligation to be void else to remain in full force.
