and bequith unto my beloved wife Margaret Seventy pounds to be Recd. of my
Estate in the next place I Give and bequith unto my Son William five Shillings
and also to my daughter Anne McCallister five Shillings and also Give and
bequith to my Son Alexander five Shillings also I Give and bequith to my Son John
Eight pounds also I Give and bequith to my daughter Mary Twenty five pounds
and a Bed and furniture also I Give and bequith to my daughter Margaret twenty
five pounds also I Give to my Grand son Andrew Robinson three pounds I also Give
and bequith unto my two Sons Robert and James Spout my plantation to them
and their Heirs or assigns forever I also will that if my Estate should not be
Sufficient to pay of the Legacies that my sons Robert and James Spout shall make
up the deficiency out of the Value of the Land and so hereby constitute make and
Ordain my wife Margaret Spout and John Wheeler my only Sole Executors of this
my last will and Testament and constitute this my only last will & Testament and do
forever disannul Revoke and disclaim all other wills & Testaments whatever in witness
