Now all Men by these presents that I John Stiff of the County of Bath and State of Virginia for Divers good Causes and considerations in haste Moving have made Executed constituted and appointed and by these presents do make constitute and appoint George M. Roberts of Lincoln County and State of Kentucky my true and lawful Attorney for me and in My Name and for my use to process and receive from Laurence Bostard or his agent, Seed of Conveyance for five hundred Acres of Land in Kentucky on the waters of Silver Creek or Six Hundred Acres on Rockcastle or Six hundred Acres on Sandy either of the places above mentioned hereby Trafficking and conveying all and whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully see or cause to be done in it touching the Premises in as full and ample manner as if myself had been personally present. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Ninth Day of September one thousand seven hundred and Ninety four
