In the name of God Amen. I Joseph Surber of Bath County being  
unwell in body but of perfect sound mind and memory and calling  
to mind my mortal state do make and ordain this my last Will and has  
I ament as to what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bless me with  
I leave and bequeath in the manner and form following Viz Item  
I leave and bequeath to my Daughter Cathrine a common bed and  
its furniture a horse and a cow and a heifer Item I leave and be-  
queath to my son John <sup>the boy</sup> that hath been mentioned to him with a new  
Vaigele Horse and bequeath to my son Joseph the Bald Colt with a  
new saddle and bridle and said Colt is to be made as valuable  
as Johns Horse in money or property out of my Estate it is my will  
that my son Henry should be put to a trade as to all my personal  
estate except what hath been distributed I leave to the care of my  
wife for the raising and support of my Children but should she  
marry my will is that my two Sons Joseph and John who I shall  
afterwards mention for Executors shall take all my estate in to  
their hands for the use of the Children and give them in other  
what the Law allows out of it, give to my two sons Joseph & John  
the use of the last cleared new field at the broad fording for five  
years but that is if they stay and work on the plantation as for-  
merly but should they or either of them go off my will is that they  
have the said field no longer then they stay to work and take  
care of the plantation but my will is as long as they stay <sup>and are</sup>  
as aforesaid that their two slaves shall be free of the place  
of any thing raised of said field mentioned to them my will is  
that after <sup>but</sup> the decease of my wife all my personal estate and also  
my plantation be sold to the best advantage and an equal  
share of the money be given to each of my children both male  
and female who shall be hereafter mentioned Viz Joseph  
John Henry Jacob George Adam Andrew Charles  
Lelia Polly Cathrine Betsy Hannah Susanah

Also its my will and mind that what goods my Daughter Catharine may get out of my estate before the death of her mother that said goods be valued and the valuation thereof to be deducted out of her share at the sale of my Plantation that is after my wife decease and lastly I do constitute and appoint my wife Mary and my two sons Joseph and John to be my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand and seal this 7<sup>th</sup> of August 1802.

This last will and Testament of Joseph Surber Dec<sup>d</sup> 1 was presented in Court and proved by Robert Suttington, Hazel Williams and J. Campbell and ordered to be Recorded

In the Name of God Amen. I Hugh McDannald of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being far advanced in years; but of a sound mind and memory calling to mind my mortality, do make and constitute this my last Will and Testament in manner following:-

I commend my soul to God who gave it and my Body to the Earth to be decently interred in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors in hope of a glorious Resurrection at the last Day:-

With regard to the worldly goods that God hath bestowed on me. I Will in the first place my Will is that all my just and lawful debts be paid. 2<sup>nd</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son John McDannald all the Power part of my landed property with all its appurtenances and the dividing Line to be established and permanently fixed as I shall now prescribe that is the division Line to commence with the River at the upper end of the new bottom the River to be the line drawn unto the mouth of the second stream hollow from the gap Run continuing up said draw from the mouth a straight direction until it unites with my Brother John's line on the top of the Hill the other part of the Dividing line to begin at the same place running up the River until the first low Gap in the Hill thence running an east South west to a corner to my Back line.

3<sup>rd</sup> I will and bequeath to my son John McDannald two Negro Men and their increase namely Bill and Charlotte. - 4<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son John McDannald one half of my Waggon 5<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth McDannald the upper end of my landed property but to be confined at the lower end by the above mentioned boundaries with a reserve of two locations which I have not fully effected. -

6<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth McDannald my Slaves namely One Negro Woman named Ellasone Do Died one Boy named Charles One Girl named Harriet Do Do named Hetty one Boy named George one Girl named Sam one Boy named Sam one Girl named Maria with all my cattle excepting three Steers all my Horses excepting two all my House Hold and Kitchen Furniture all the money I have arising from my Sister Elizabeth Suttington's Estate excepting Sixty Dollars which is to come out of the Surplus of that Estate after the Legacies are paid which sum will devise hereafter.

7<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Wife Elizabeth McDannald the money coming from Hugh Wickline Estate to me.

8<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald two Locations Number of Acres not recollect one of them lying on the West side of the plantation I now live on the other on the East.

9<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald three Steers of the largest kind

10<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald two Horses namely his Riding Horse and a Brown Horse called Ranger.

11<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald one half of my Waggon.

12<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Hugh McDannald my Stock of Hogs, Sheep, Farming utensile, all my crop of Corn and Garage

13<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Peage and her Heirs of her Body Four Slaves namely Hannah, Harriet, Maria and others.

14<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Peage Sixty Dollars to be paid by my Executors out of the Surplus money arising from the Estate of Elizabeth Suttington and her heirs.

15<sup>th</sup> I now call and appoint my Son John McDannald Executor of this my last Will and Testament disannulling all others heretofore made by me and declare this alone to be my last Will and Testament.

16<sup>th</sup> It is my Will should any difficulty arise as to the intentions or explanation of any of the devices made by me that the Party or Parties as the case may be from this interested Characters bound for a upright wife and they choose a trial and decision to be final to all intents and purposes in this behalf I have however set my hand & Seal this 15<sup>th</sup> day of Oct 1825
