In the Name of God Amen I Leonard Herring of the
 County of Bath Viewing the uncertainty of life & the
 certainty of Death and being now very sick and weak
 in body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks
 be to God for the same, do hereby make my last will
 and Testament in manner and Form following, that
 is to say, in the first place, I desire that my beloved
 wife Abigail after my decease shall keep possession
 of all my Land on Back Creek with all my moveable
 property as long as she lives except only forty
 acres of Land that my son in law John Ennis now
 lives on at the decease of my beloved wife Abigail
 all the above mentioned personal estate to be sold

to the best advantage and the money to be equally divided amongst
 my four daughters Betty, Anne Abigail and Esther. I also
 will that Betty my Negro woman shall be for the use
 of my beloved wife so long as my wife may live and then
 if said Negro woman Betty is alive to be sold for the
 best price, and the money to be equally divided amongst
 my four daughters above mentioned, also at the death of
 my beloved wife Abigail I give and bequeath to my
 two Grand sons Benjamin and Leonard Herring all my
 Land on Back Creek except forty acres above mentioned
 which I give and bequeath to the above mentioned two
 Grand sons and his heirs, and furthermore I desire that if
 my wife Abigail should die before my two Grand sons
 Benjamin and Leonard arrive at the age of twenty one
 years then the above mentioned Land to be for the use
 of my son in law Robert Ennis until my Grand son
 Benjamin arrive at the age of nineteen years old
 then the two above named Grand sons to have an equal
 part of the product of the plantation with said Ennis
 by doing an equal part of the labour, until the said
 Benjamin arrive at the age of twenty one years, I
 desire also that if either of the above mentioned Grand
 sons should die before he arrive at the age of twenty
 one then the surviving brother to have all, and if both
 should die before the arrive at full age then the
 Land to be equally divided amongst my four daughters
 aforesaid I do appoint my son in law Robert Ennis
 and my good friend James Hamilton Esq^r executor
 of this my last will and Testament, In Witness where
 of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5th
 day of July 1808

Know all men by these presents that we James Hechler John Brown and Joseph Mayes are held and firmly bound unto William W. Cabell, Esquire, Governor of Virginia and his successors for the time being in the sum of five thousand dollars to which payment well and truly to be made we bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated the 8th day of November 1808

The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above bound James Hechler is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the County of Bath by commission from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the 27th day of July last past If therefore the said James Hechler shall well and truly collect and receive all officers fees and dues put into his hands to collect and duly account for and pay the same to the officers to whom such fees are due respectively at such times as are prescribed and limited by Law and shall well and truly execute and due return make of all process and precept to him directed and pay and satisfy all sums of money and taxes by him received by virtue of such process to the person or persons to whom the same are due his or their executor administrator or assigns and in all other things shall truly and faithfully execute and perform the said office of Sheriff during the time of his continuance thereof
