county and State of Virginia being at present of sound
mind and memory do make and execute after this my
last will and Testament in the manner following
My immortal spirit I give to God who gave it me
my body to be restored to the Earth in full hope of a
reunion in the general Resurrection. And as touching
the temporal things which God hath blessed me
I will and bequeath them as follows: In the first place
I will and bequeath to my son Alexander Miller the
plantation on which I now live lying in the County aforesaid
together with all entries or locations that I have made
desiring it to him and his heirs or assigns forever
reserving to my daughter Margaret Miller her living
upon said plantation while unmarried and my

and I command shall build for her of the stones as
House convenient to his own of hewed Logs and shingled
and made ready and convenient for her accommodation
she shall also furnish her with what is necessary for her
living of meat and bread; and keep two Cows for her and
a Horse calculated while the Contractor remains there
also keeps for her four Sheep and provide for her half
an acre of land yearly. Saler will not bequeath to
my two Sons Robert and John Miller that Plantation
which I hold on Little Creek in Greenbrier County and
Sale of Virginia adjoining the lands of James Gwinne
to be divided as equally between them as may be
according to quantity and quality to them and their
heirs and assigns forever according my Son Robert
when so divided to have the first choice also
bequeath to my Son Robert Miller my negro woman
Catherine to him and his heirs and assigns forever—
I bequeath to my Son John Miller my negro boy Dennis
to him and his heirs and assigns forever also will
also in that my Son Alexander Miller shall pay to
my daughter Margaret Miller fifty Pounds Lawful
money of Virginia in Consideration of his leaving
the Plantation bequeathed to him. My will is that
all my other Property Books and Farming Utensils
excepted shall be sold at publick Auction as soon as
Convenient after my death, and the money thereby
arising to be equally divided amongst my three named
children to wit, Jean Early, Mary, Benson, Elizabeth
Black, Robert Miller John Miller and Margaret
Miller all my family Belts I leave to Robert Miller
The Works of Josephus to be equally divided between
my three Sons Robert John & Alexander Miller each
one Quarter I leave to my Son John Miller my
Bodkinery to Alexander Miller, my Farming Utensils
I leave to my Son Alexander Miller before my dis-
tributions taken place my wife is dead all my just
debts to be duly discharged — but in Order that the
above Will may be duly executed I do appoint and

constituted my son Alexander Miller and my friend John Brown executors of this my last will and Testament revoking and disannulling all other wills by me made and do declare this above to be my last will and Testament - In Testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixing my seal this twenty second day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five - 1805





