The Condition of this obligation is that if the said John Clark Executor of the last will and Testament with the will annexed of all the Goods and Credits of James Clark Dec^d do make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said Dec^d which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him his Heirs John Clark or into the hands or possession of any other Person or Persons for them and the same to make as Exhibited into the County Court at such time as they shall be thereto Required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattels and Credits do well and truly administer according to Law and Make a just and true account of their doings and earnings therein when therunto Required by the said Court and further do well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said will as far as the said Goods Chattels and Credits will extend according to the Value thereof and as the Law shall Charge them then this Obligation to be void and Else to Remain in full force

In the Name of God Amen Ralph Savory of the County of Augusta and Commonwealth of Virginia concerning the administration of the last will and living of James Clark and showing as the public Thanks to almighty God for the same do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following (Compressed) First and Order all my just Debts to be paid. Item I give and Bequeath to my Beloved wife Jane one third of all my personal Estate one young boy born and saddle a small Man on his forehead and a High of three years old of a spotted Cream Color and two High carrying his widow hood but at her Marriages or Death Wife and Dear Child Good and Challen to be given to the second eldest son of John Hambleton of the County of Rockbridge and State of Virginia which is my Grand son of the Name of Ralph Nova about six months old I likewise give and Bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca Hambleton six High white and one of the same order of my personal Estate Wife and Order to be Equally divided between my three daughters Anne Rebecca and Sarah Clark (to said Sarah (Clark one Long Rider (Saddled) and a black Mare) to my son William Savory because the sum of five hundred Virginia Currency to be paid Out of my wife Jane's part which said several Legacies Wife and order to be paid to the said Legacies Legacies within six months after my decease further give and devise to my said Daughter Rebecca Hambleton all my Chattels real Consisting of a certain tract of Land Consisting of a about three hundred Acres situated on the Cuspashore River at the Mouth of Stricks Creek together with forty five Acres then unto annexed by Virtue of a Patent to hold to her the said Rebecca Hambleton during her Natural Life and at her Decease to Revert to her second eldest son above mentioned of the Name of Ralph Hambleton and his Heirs forever And lastly I appoint my Son in Law the above mentioned John Hambleton and my Beloved wife Jane the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament Writing and Subscribing all former wills by me made in and out of my Name Annulled and void and that the seventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety two at the death time was witnessed before signed

Now all men by these presents that Catherine Whitman of Bath County in the State of Virginia have named and constituted and by these presents do name and appoint and make Abraham Black and Henry Black of Hardy County in the State of Virginia my true and faithful attorney for me and in my Name and to my use to Demand due for Me and my heirs on certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Bucks in the State of Pennsylvania and Macarison Township and being ing George Applebach and Samuel Morris Lands which said Lands belonged to John Henry now Deceased giving and hereby granting unto my said attorney my full power and authority to use and exercise all such Acts things and services in the Law as shall be necessary for Recovery of the said Land and to make and give Acquittances or other Discharges in my Name and Generally to do and Execute in the Premises as fully as I my self might or could do being personally present Trafficking Confirming and allowing all and whatsoever my said attorney shall Lawfully do in virtue to be done herein by virtue of these presents.
