Bill
In the name of God almighty I Robert Dinwiddie of Jacksons River
Bath County and State of Virginia now in the late Evening of my days
but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God and knowing that it
is appointed for all men once to die and calling to mind the mortality of
my Body do this twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord one
thousand Seven hundred and Ninety I make and ordain this my last
will and Testament principally and first of all I Recommend my Soul
to God who give it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be
Buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Exe-
cutors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive
the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching my worldly
Estate what God here has bestowed upon me I dispose in the following
manner and form to wit To my Son William Dinwiddie I leave my
plantation all the land I possess to him his heirs and assigns forever upon
the account that he keeps four horses and two hores for his mother providing
winter forage for them and all other necessaries for her that she wants
during her natural life and to my dear wife Elisabeth Dinwiddie
I leave all my moveable Estate to her forever to be at her disposal after death
I leave to John Dinwiddie that I have kept from a child thirty pounds
to be paid Said money by my Son William Dinwiddie to the Said John
Dinwiddie at five pounds per year untille whole be paid and no more
now do my will and orders that if my Son William Dinwiddie sells
the land at any time I leave the half of what the land will be valued
to by three freeholders thstts acquaint in the parts and knows the Land
let him sell it as he will to my Grand Sons to wit Robert Dinwiddie
my Son James Son also to Matthew Patent and John his Brother Sons
belonging to my daughter Elisabeth also to William Kinkead Son
to my daughter Mary and also to Thomas Robert Charles James William
and Stephen Wilson Sons belonging to my daughter Jane —
to James Dinwiddie my Son Stephen Wilson and his wife James
Patent and John Kinkead and his wife to each of these I leave five
Shillings funeral money of Virginia and no more I allow my Son
William Dinwiddie to be my Executor to this my will in Trust I
Revoke and disannul all other Gifts Grants or legacies ever Spoken of
or mentioned by me preceding this date this and no other before this and
to confirm all the above contents of this my will I gives it under
my hand and Seal the day and year above written —

amount of the Publick Taxes imposed by law within the said County
of Math' for the year 1795 as the law directs then the above obligation
