In the Name of God Amen I Robert McGuffin
of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being
weak in body, but in perfect mind and Memory
and knowing well that its ordained for all Men
once to die to Make and Ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament: That is to say in the first place
I will that all my Just Debts shall be paid, as soon
it may be convenient for my Executors after my
Death - and Settling my worldly Matters I will
the whole of my Estate to my wife Elizabeth
McGuffin, Except such articles as are herein Particu-
larly Mentioned That is to say I will to Nancy

M'Guffin (Daughter of James M'Guffin) a
 Her and a Heifer which I have heretofore given
 to her and also a Bed and furniture to her use
 and her heirs forever — also I give to James
 Nicholson M'Guffin son of James M'Guffin
 a Heifer which I had heretofore gave to him —
 I also will to Robert M'Guffin son to James
 M'Guffin all my Tools including my crop but
 saw to him and his heirs for ever — I will that
 all my Stock of Cattle which I have not other-
 wise disposed shall be sold in the month of Oc-
 tober next by my Executors Herein Named —
 I will to my wife Elizabeth M'Guffin my
 Horse during her natural life and at her death
 the said Horse is to be the property of Robert
 M'Guffin with my saddle Bridle and Saddle
 Bags to him his and his heirs forever — and I do
 appoint Adam Given and my son James M'Guffin
 to be the Executors of this my last will and Testa-
 ment. in witness I have Hereunto subscribed
 my name and affixed my Seal this 30th day
 of December 1823

Know all men by these presents that we Henry
 Frazier Thomas Patton Jacob Grose Henry Miller
 James Hamilton Andrew H. Byrd & Lewisell Rich-
 ards are held and firmly bound unto Alexander
 M'Clinton Andrew S. Warwick William M'Clinton
 & George Hicklin Gentlemen Justices of the Court
 of Bath County now sitting in the sum of eight
 thousand Dollars To the payment whereof, well
 and truly to be made to the said Justices, and
 their Successors, we bind ourselves and each of us
 our and each of our heirs executors and adminis-
 trators jointly and severally firmly by these pre-
 sents. Sealed with our seals and dated this 11th
 day of May 1824 and in the 18th year of the
 Commonwealth — The condition of the above
 obligation is such that whereas the above bound
 Nancy Frazier late Nancy Shaw administratrix
 of the goods and chattels and credits of George
 Shaw deceased hath heretofore executed a bond
 payable to Walter Richards George Hicklin
 Robert Bratton & Samuel Ruckman and con-
 ditioned for the discharge of her duties as ad-
 ministratrix as aforesaid, which said bond bears
 date the 11th day of November 1823 who hath since
 that time intermarried with S^r Henry Frazier
 and whereas by an order of Court made on
 the 13th day of April 1824 other bond and security
 hath been required of the said administratrix &
 administrator now therefore if the said adminis-
 tratrix and administrator shall well and truly
 have kept and performed, and shall well and truly
 keep and perform, the condition of the bond afoe-
 said, and shall in all respects have performed
 and continue to perform the duties of their office
 aforesaid, then this obligation to be void, otherwise
 it shall remain in full force and virtue
