Witness all now by these presents that the James Blumensie of Sevier County and State of Tennessee for some considerations and good causes have Ordained Constituted and appointed and by these presents do make Ordains Constituted and appoint my truly friend John McGee of Sevier County and State of Tennessee my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to him and acknowledges a deed for a certain tract of land lying in the State of Virginia in Bath County adjoining Robert Atkinson in the upper end and Richard Morgan on the lower end to William Douglas by John McGee Mary Blumensie and James Blumensie and I the said James Blumensie do hereby authorize and empower S. McGee to sign acknowledge and make over my whole right of the above mentioned land to said Douglas and his heirs forever as fully thoroughly and entirely as I could do were I personally present myself satisfying attorney and confirming whatsoever my attorney shall do about the same.
