ning at Sam^r Jones his^r house upwards so as to include all
the land on both sides of the river as far up the bottom
as an old line made on two white trees about forty rods
below the little creek to him and his heirs forever.
I give to my son Benjamin Vance in present possession
the upper part of the plantation from the said first line &
inwards with with the other plantation on both banks
creek containing one hundred and fifty acres, the
remaining part of my land dwelling house Richards &
together with a negro boy named Bob and a girl named
Polly. I leave to my beloved wife Sarah Vance during her
natural life at her decease the land our Bob is to go
to my son Benjamin Vance. This being proved and
my wife Sarah is to give Polly to any of our children that
she may see fit. I leave to each of my daughters that
are or have been married one dollar in addition to
what I have heretofore given, except Abby Allard who
is to receive ^{to} Fifty and three. Fifty in less thereof

sum to her and her heirs forever. I leave my daughter
Nancy a negro girl named Sarah to her and her
