In the Name of God Amen I Mary Moore of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for his mercies and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men and women once to die first I Recommend my soul to the Almighty God who gave it me nothing doubting but I shall Receive the same again by the power of Almighty God at the General Resurrection, and as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I do Order and Ordain in the following manner first, I Recommend my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian and decent ~~burial~~ <sup>interment</sup>, and all my just debts and funeral charges to be paid at the discretion of my executor hereafter named, Secondly I Order and allow that my well beloved daughter Peggy Moore shall have a certain tract of land containing twenty six acres by survey bearing date the twenty seventh day of March in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty three and bearing my whom plantation and thirdly I Order and allow that my well beloved daughter Sally Moore with my daughter Peggy before mentioned shall have all my whom plantation in which I now

Reside to be equally divided between them according to quantity and quality and as for any other property which I formerly gave them I Order and allow each of them to have and to hold what they now possess and all the lands and property above mentioned and in the manner above described, I Order and allow it to my two daughters Sally and Peggy above mentioned their heirs and assigns forever, and faithfully I also ordain constitute and appoint James Kelsa to be the whole and sole Executor of this my last will and testament and to see that the same is carried into execution according to the true intent and meaning thereof In Witness whereof I the said Mary Moore have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of July year one thousand eight hundred

by Anthony Minter Justice of said County that Charles Rogers  
who was committed to the Jail of the said County for want of  
bail at the suit of James McElhinney on a note of hand for  
seven thousand four hundred and dollars did on or about the  
16th day of June last past make his escape out of the Jail  
of the said County and is now going at large, there are therefore  
in the name of the Commonwealth to require you and every  
of you in your respective Counties Rigs towns and precincts to  
seek and retake the said Charles Rogers and him so retaken  
to commit to the prison where debtors are usually kept in the  
County where he is so retaken and deliver him to the keeper

theroff together with this Warrant hereby commanding and requiring  
the said keeper to receive the said Charles Rogers and him safely keep  
in the said Jail until a Certificate under the hand of the Clerk of the  
District Court of Hantsdown that the said Charles Rogers hath given  
bail in the said suit to be delivered to you and to return this Warrant  
to the Court of the said County of Bath pursuant to the act of the Ge-  
neral assembly in that case made and provided. Given under my hand  
and seal this day of Aug<sup>r</sup> 1800 A Dickinson Seal

Mr. Robert Constable or other Officer takes and delivers the said  
Charles Rogers to the Jail of Bath County for receive twenty dollars  
for extra trouble to be paid by the Bailor.

Executed on the 25th day of June 1803 on Charles Rogers who had  
been before then imprisoned under a process Warrant for want of  
sufficient sureties and which Charles Rogers made his escape  
from the said Jail.
