In the Name of God Amen I Andrew Fittington of the County of Bath & State of Virginia being for advanced in years but of sound & perfect mind & memory calling to mind my mortality do make & constitute this my last will & Testament in manner following, I commend my soul to God who gave it & my body to the earth to be decently interred in a Christian manner at the direction of my executors in hope of a glorious Resurrection at the last day with regards to the worldly goods which God has bestowed upon me I will & devise them in manner following, In the first place my will is that all my just and lawful debts shall be faithfully paid, I also will & bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Fittington all my moveable estate except what shall be hereafter otherwise disposed of to her & to her heirs forever, I also will & bequeath unto her the said Elizabeth Fittington the plantation on which I now live together with the location adjoining it for which I have obtained a patent.

To all to whom these presents may appear be it known unto you, and every of you that for Sumner's good Cause moving me therunto, I do for myself and in the name and behalf of my heirs, exors and assigns and every of them, Release, discharge & Emancipate a certain Negro man known by the name of Jerry which Negro Jerry I purchased at the sale of my late husband's (Thomas Fenster's) estate. Notwithstanding the said Jerry is to remain with me and in my service during my natural life and from the date of my decease whenever that shall happen to be, he the said Jerry shall be fully emancipated and discharged from all service, and from the claim claims or demands of all and every person or persons, whatever claiming or to claim in my name under any pretence whatever, and the said Jerry shall be fully intitled to all the privileges granted to emancipated Slaves by the Laws of the Comth of Virginia agreeable to the full intent and meaning of these presents in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26th day of June in the

year of our last one thousand eight hundred and four and twenty eighth year of the Comth
