In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 1808.

Know all men by these presents that John McCarty of the County of Bath and State of Virginia for and in consideration of one hundred sixty two dollars paid in hand to give grant bargain and sell unto Polly McCarty of County and State aforesaid the following property to wit one brown cow of the value of twenty five dollars one Red cow of the value of twelve dollars one Red and white cow two dollars one black cow eleven dollars one brown cow two dollars one Red and white cow two dollars one Red cow two dollars one Red heifer five dollars three calves of the value of five dollars five beds furniture of the value of thirty six dollars table and kitchen furniture of the value of twenty dollars forming upwards of the value of twelve dollars to have the said Polly McCarty to have and to hold the said property forever and said John McCarty for himself his heirs executors to do warrant and defend the said property unto the said Polly McCarty his executors to against all claims whatsoever in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this second day of February 1808
