I Thomas Galford son, Citizen of Bath County & State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory and calling to mind the frailty of this mortal body and being desirous to dispose of my property I do make this my last will and Testament Resolving all others first I desire all my just debts to be paid, Secondly I do will and bequeath my beloved wife Francis the plantation & farming Utensils I now live on during her life or widowhood except so much as shall hereafter stated. I also give her all my household goods utensils except my best and one large chest, to be entirely at her disposal. I also give her the choice of my horses & two saddles and two of my best cows. Thirdly I give to my son Thomas my plantation I now live on after the death of my wife on the following conditions that is he must pay my daughter Nancy one hundred Dollars, also he must pay my daughter Sarah one hundred Dollars of his free, to pay the aforesaid two hundred Dollars immediately after the death of my wife the land is to be sold to the best advantage by my Executors and when they collect the money they must my son Thomas give hundred Dollars & fifty Dollars Fourthly I give to my daughter Nancy a piece of land

containing 30 acres one horse & saddle & Bridle & and one mare which is now named to her. I also give her my chest & clock and if my son Thomas fails to pay my daughter Nancy one hundred Dollars agreeable to the conditions aforesaid and the land has to be sold my Executors is to pay her one hundred Dollars out of the first payment of the land. Fifthly I give to my daughter Jane one black mare, an a cart and two horses & saddle & Bridle, and also my best & saddle, and my son Thomas fails to pay my daughter Jane one hundred Dollars agreeable to the conditions aforesaid, and the land has to be sold, the Executor is to pay her one hundred Dollars out of the first payment of the land, and after my death I desire my Executors to make sale of all my property not otherwise disposed of and make an equal divide, when the money is collected, between my daughter Mary my son William, my son John, my daughter Betsey, my son Thomas, my daughter Nancy, & my daughter Jane, and if my son Thomas fails to comply with the conditions aforesaid, and the land is to be sold, and my son Thomas gets five hundred and fifty Dollars, and my daughter Nancy gets one hundred and fifty Dollars & my daughter Jane gets one hundred Dollars the balance of the price of the land I wish to be equally divided between my daughters Mary & Betsey my son, William & John & my daughter Nancy & Jane, I allow my daughter Nancy & Jane to have their living off the land while they live single, or during my wife's lifetime. Lastly, I constitute Joseph Wooddell & Sampson Matthews my Executors, given under my hand & seal this 20th day of January 1818
