In the name of God amen I Robert Dimwidie of Jackson River
Walth family and State of Virginia now in the late Evening of my days
but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God and knowing that it
appointed for all men Once to die and calling to mind the mortality of
my Body do this twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord one
thousand Seven hundred and ninety Six make and ordain this my last
will and Testament principally and first of all I Recommend my Soul
to God who give it and for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth to be
Buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Ex-
ecutors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall Receive
the Same again by the mighty power of God and as Touching my worldly
Estate what God has bestowed upon me I dispose in the following
manner and form to wit: to my Son William Dimwidie I leave my
plantation all the land I possess to him his heirs and assigns forever upon
the account that he keeps four cows and two horses for his mother providing
winter forage for them and all other necessaries for her that She wants
during her natural life and to my dear wife Elisabeth Dimwidie
I leave all my moveable Estate to her forever to be at her disposal at her death
I leave to John Dimwidie that I have kept from a child thirty pounds
to be paid Said money by my Son William Dimwidie to the Said John
Dimwidie at five pounds per year untill whole be paid and no more
now is my will and orders that if my Son William Dimwidie Sells
the land at any time I leave the half of what the land will be valued
to by three freeholders that acquaint in the parts and knows the land
let him Sell it as he will to my Grand Sons to wit Robert Dimwidie
my Son James Son also Matthew Patent and John his Brother Sons
Belonging to my daughter Elisabeth also to William Kinkaid Son
to my daughter Mary and also to Thomas Robert Charles James Wil-
liam and Stephen Willson Sons belonging to my daughter Jane
to James Dimwidie my Son Stephen Wilson and his wife James
Patent and John Kinkaid and his wife to each of them I leave five
Shillings current money of Virginia and no more. I allow my Son
William Dimwidie to be my Executor to this my will in Trust I
Revoke and disannuls all other Wills Gifts or Legacies ever Spoken of
or mentioned by me preceding this date this and no other before this and
to confirm all the above contents of this my will I Press it upon
my hand and Seal the day and year above written
