

In the name of God amen I Thomas Mithollens of the county of Bath and Commonwealth of Virginia being seriously impressed with the uncertainty of human life and calamity of death and now being of sound mind and disposing memory do dispose of all my estate in manner following that is to say being thorough that all my just debts should be paid as soon as practicable after my decease I will and desire that all my personal ~~part~~ partly exclusive of my slaves together with the following parts of my lands to wit. Beginning at the land corner of the old survey on the South Side of Cedar Creek at a Spanish Oak at the foot of a steep bank thence straight up that bank to the top of the same thence along the edge of the bank crossing the waygon road at a place where it turns down towards the mill thence bearing a little to the right with a marked line made for the purpose to the mouth of a hollow thence up that hollow line still marked to an open line of a survey lying on Cedar Creek and along the line of that survey towards the creek to the corner of that line at the foot of a hill near the swamp thence along the line of another survey to the bank of the creek thence down the creek the several courses of the same at high water mark to the mouth of the Hot Spring Run thence down the creek to a juncture and by a narrow gulch nearly opposite the land thence crossing the creek and through a small Island to the mouth of a ~~part~~ and running with the left hand fence of that land a straight line as far as my land extends thence down the creek including all the land I own on that side of the creek so as to join the place of beginning shall be sold by my Executors in such manner and at such times as they may think best for the benefit of my Estate and out of the money arising from such sales first pay all my funeral expenses and then my just debts - Now I will and bequeath unto my daughter Mary all my other lands lying above and adjoining the

lands before described to be sold and including the land and a saw mill and every thing appertaining thereto and use thereof to her and her heirs in consideration of which it is my will that my said daughter Mary shall pay unto my Executors the sum of two hundred Dollars within two years after my decease - Now I will and bequeath unto my said daughter Mary a feather bed and furniture already claimed by her and also all the cow beats claimed by her and known as her own and to her heirs together with a grazing lease and a small town - Now I will and bequeath unto my son Thomas and his heirs all my other lands by which title seven lots and not before herein disposed of which includes the part he at present lives on in consideration of which legacy ^{it is my will} that my said son Thomas shall pay unto my Executors the sum of three hundred dollars within two years from my decease - Now I will and bequeath that my Executors so soon as they convenient by law shall pay unto my son William and Patrick and my daughter Elizabeth one hundred Dollars each - Now I will and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah and her heirs five hundred Dollars to be paid her by my Executors out of the money which may come into their hands this I give to her in compliance with a promise made at the request of her mother - Now I will and bequeath that my Executors pay unto my son Williams one hundred dollars to be applied by him in schooling a son of Mary Williams now Mary Bowen which son Andrew was said to be a Bishop of my son Patrick Mithollens I will this sum of one hundred dollars to be applied as aforesaid provided the boys mother consent and the said Andrew shall be bound unto my said son Williams according to law and in no other condition - As it is my desire that my slaves to wit Kate and her three children Isaac Charles and John should not be retained in slavery after my decease I will and direct that my daughter Mary and my son Thomas out of the legacy left them do furnish my said slaves Kate and her three children with her suits of strong new clothes and with money necessary for conveying them to the state of Ohio and that my said son Thomas carry them

there, and devised them to my son in law Jeremiah Sims
and that said Jeremiah Sims bind the said hand Charles,
and John to learn said trades agreeably to the laws of
that commonwealth until they severally arrived to the age
of twenty one years, at which time it is my will that
they be free, and that the said Jeremiah Sims have and
enjoy the services of the said Kate until her residence
there under the laws of that state, and my will was in-
titled her to her freedom, and also should it be necessary
upon the introduction of my said slaves into the state of
Ohio to pay any tax to the commonwealth, it is my
will that the said Jeremiah Sims pay the same out
of the legacies left by me to his wife Sarah. - The balance
of my Estate that may remain after paying the legacies,
expenses whatever it may be, I will, and bequeath to
be equally divided between my daughter Sarah, and
Margaret, and a natural son of my sister Esther deceased
named John Middleton now living with my brother Rob-
ert Middleton and to their heirs, but should the said
John Middleton die before he marries or arrives to the
age of twenty one years it is my will that his part
shall go to my said daughter Sarah and Margaret and
lastly I do appoint Charles Cameron Robert Kincaid
Charles L. Francisco and my son Thomas Middleton executors
of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all
other wills by me heretofore made declaring this only to be
my last will and Testament. In Testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
first day of September, in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and eighteenth
