In the Name of God, I Thomas Wallace of Bala County & State of Virginia being of perfect mind and disposing M^rury do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament and do bequeath my worldly Substance in manner following to Wit I do will and bequeath unto my loving wife Sarah Wallace her living in the house I now live in during her M^rieship or her Right of dower agreeable to the laws of this County at her election I will and bequeath unto my son David Sixty Six Dollars to be paid out of my whole personal Estate I will that my three sons Josiah, John and Benjamin be bound apprentices to a trade each to such as my Ex^t P^t S^t Sons (to Wit) Josiah, John, & Benjamin shall chose, I will and bequeath to my Daughter Polly two hundred Dollars to her & Saddle worth Sixty Dollars I will that each of my three sons to Wit, Josiah, John & Benjamin, be paid each of them at the expiration of their apprenticeship Sixty six dollars, I will that my daughter Nancy be paid one hundred Dollars, I will and Ordain that the above sum as Specified be paid out of my personal Estate. I will and bequeath unto my three Sons to Wit, Matthew Joseph and Thomas due to their their occupations all my lands & tenements to hold the same in fee Simple and the better to see that this my last will & Testament may be put in full Execution I do appoint and do by these presents Constitute and Ordain my two Sons Matthew Wallace & Thomas Wallace and my friend John Brown as my Executors to see that the same may be performed making and discharging all former acts in relation In Testimony whereof I have known to set my hand and affixed my seal this 10th day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred Ninety Nine

of her right of dower agreeable to the laws of this Commonwealth
or any will or testament made by the aforesaid Thomas Wallace
in his lifetime, or any election or choice she the said Sarah
might have made at a subsequent date and that in consideration
of such relinquishment, we the aforesaid Matthew, Joseph and
Thomas Wallace do promise and covenant to furnish and deliver
to the said Sarah Wallace for her own proper uses, two cows
one young Mare, two beds broadbeds & covering for said beds,
a suitable log house with a plank, or slab floor, and loft, convenient
to wood water, with a garden fence in, and also to furnish
her the said Sarah Wallace yearly & every year during her
natural life twenty bushels of corn, eight bushels of wheat,
two hundred pounds of pork, one hundred pounds of beef, one
stack of hay of the common size, straw for two cows, tobacco
three pickets of flax seed, and privilege to get apples for house
use to the true and faithful performance of each and every
of the above recited articles, and agreements entered into we
entirely and bind ourselves to each other in the sum of
two hundred pounds, to be paid half yearly of term time

bail at the suit of James M'Elvining on a note of hand for
seven thousand four hundred and dollar did on or about the
16th day of June last past make his escape out of the jail
of the said County and is now going at large, there are therefore
in the Name of the Commonwealth to require you and every
of you in your respective Counties Cities towns and precincts to
seize and take the said Charles Rogers and him so taken
to commit to the prison where debtors are usually kept in the
County where he is so taken and deliver him to the keeper

thereoff together with this Warrant hereby commanding and requiring
the said keeper to receive the said Charles Rogers and have safely kept
in the said jail until a certificate under the hand of the Clerk of the
District Court of Stanly that the said Charles Rogers hath given
bail in the said suit to be delivered to you and to return this warrant
to the Court of the said County of Bath pursuant to the acts of the Ge-
neral Assembly in that case made and provided. Given under my hand
and seal this day of Aug^o 1803 A.D. D. Dickenson Seal

At Whatever Constable or other Officer takes and delivers the said
Charles Rogers to the jailor of Bath County for keeping twenty dollars
for extra trouble to be paid by the jailor.

Decided on the 25th day of June 1803 on Charles Rogers who had
been before them imprisoned under a peace Warrant for want of
sufficient security and which Charles Rogers made his escape
from the said jail.
