The condition of the above Obligation is such that whereas the above bound James Hamilton is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the county of Bath by commission given the Governor under the seal of the commonwealth dated the 10th day of September last past. If therefore the said James Hamilton shall well and truly exact all debts & amount for & pay the same in such manner as is by law directed & also all fines forfeitures and amercements accruing or becoming due to the commonwealth in the said county & shall duly account for and pay the same to the Treasurer of the commonwealth for the time being for the use of the said commonwealth in the manner as is by law shall be directed in the case of public taxes and in all other things shall truly and faithfully execute the said office of Sheriff during the term of his continuance therein then the above Obligation to be void else to remain in full force

Supremus I give my soul to Almighty God who gives it humbly hoping through the mercy of my Redeemer to receive everlasting life and as for my body I bequeath it to the Earth therein to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after to be named and trusting what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same as follows Now after paying all my last debts and funeral expenses the residue to be divided as follows Now I leave to my beloved wife Alice all the household furniture that I bought here since I was married to her and further Reside any claims to any Property that was here

Now I bequeath my bequest to see one plantation in the county of Greenbush county at the Rockwell Mountain of one thousand Acres and the residue of all my property land and every thing except my share and the money arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided between all my children except Nancy which is to have one hundred Dollars and my share the most. I hereby appoint my beloved wife Alice my sole executrix of this my last will and Testament and do hereby revoke and annul any will or wills by me heretofore made the Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of August 1818
