Amen I William Dinwiddie of the County of Bath and State of Virginia being sick and weak in Body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) and calling to mind the uncertainty of human Life. and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with. — 1<sup>st</sup> I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after after my Decease and out of the monies arising therefrom, all my Just Debts and funeral expences be paid. — 2<sup>nd</sup> after the payment of my Debts and funeral expences I give to my Wife Mary all my estate both Real and personal For and the Term of her natural Life and after her Decease to be divided as follows. —

3<sup>rd</sup> I give to and allow my executors full and free privilege to sell all my Land and Slaves (only one Negro girl named Ann that I give to and allow my wife Mary to will or give at her own Discretion) and appropriate the monies arising from s<sup>d</sup> Sales as follows (Viz: 1<sup>st</sup> I give to John Dinwiddie (Living in the State of Ohio) (being a Boy that I raised) the Sum of four hundred dollars. and the Residue of the monies

to be equally divided between my Brothers and sisters Children. Say James Dinwiddies Children Jane Wisons Children Mary Kincaids Children and Elizabeth Pattons Children to each an a every Child alike Sums of Money. — and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Mary and Adam Given executors and executor of this My Last Will and Testament Hereby revoking all other or former Wills or Testaments by me Heretofore made In witness whereof I have Hereunto Set my hand
