certain this Instrument to be my last Will
and Testament for the disposal of my worldly
Estate First I bequeath that all my Just
Ditto & legal paid Secondly after the
payment of my Just Debt, I give and Bequeath
to my son James Dixon one Dollar Thirdly I
give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Dixon
one Dollar, Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my

Son John Dixon one Dollar Fifthly I give and be-
queath to my Daughter Polly Brown one Dollar
Sixthly I give and bequeath to my Son Robert Dixon
one Dollar Seventhly I give and bequeath to my
Daughter Elizabeth Potts one Dollar Eighthly all
the rest of my estate both real and personal I give
and bequeath to my dear Wife Elizabeth Dixon
to her her heirs and assigns forever, Lastly I constitute
and appoint my Wife Elizabeth Dixon and my Son
Robert Dixon Executors of this my last Will and
Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 17th day of August in the year
of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty (1820)
