do and to close word Take all lawful Means and ways in
my Name or otherwise and to agree and Compromise for the same
and signification or other sufficient Discharges for the same for me
and in my Name Make Seal and deliver and to do all other Lawfull
Acts and Things what ever concerning the premises as fully in
Every Respect as I myself could or might do if I were personally
present. Attorneys On a Month Man him for the purpose to Make
and at his pleasure Revokes — Witness my hand and Seal this

Roberts of Lincoln County and State of Kentucky my true and lawful Attorney for me and in My Name and for my use to process and receive from Laurence Bostard or his agent, Seed of Conveyance for five hundred Acres of Land in Kentucky on the waters of Silver Creek or Six Hundred Acres on Rockcastle or Six hundred Acres on Sandy either of the places above mentioned hereby Trafficking and conveying all and whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully see or cause to be done in it touching the Premises in as full and ample manner as if myself had been personally present. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Ninth Day of September one thousand seven hundred and Ninety four
