 Lewis Being Out of Perfect mind and memory and Calling to Mind
 the Mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for all men Once to
 Die do make and constitute this my Last will and Testament
 Touching and Respecting all other Wills or Testaments heretofore Made
 But this Only — and in the first Place I here make my Son John
 who gave to me and my Body to the South to be Buried in a decent
 manner at the Discretion of my Executors and as for the
 worldly things which God has been pleased to Bestow upon me with
 I give in the following Manner that is to say I give my Beloved
 wife Nancy her Bed and Furniture and all her Wearing Apparel also the
 Best Horse or more that I have that she will Choose Likewise
 and Equal Part with my Children of the personal Estate and
 also the Muttatto Girl named my During my wife's Natural life
 and at her Death to Devise to James John George and Henry and my
 Two youngest Daughters son and Peggy and Likewise my said
 Beloved wife is to Live in the Mansion house in or near the same and
 to have a decent and sufficient maintenance of my
 Plantation During her widowhood and as for my Lands
 which I now possess and occupying this my Man in
 Plantation I give to my sons Samuel Aaron James John George
 and Henry jointly to them their Heirs and assigns forever and
 on the Devise of the Muttatto Girl viz that Samuel and
 Aaron have an Equal Share with the other younger
 Brothers. I further will that the Land I Bought of David
 Graggy and Land I Bought of Jack Graggy occupying the
 same on North Creek I give unto my son William his Heirs and
 assigns forever and as for my personal Estate I will to be
 Equally Divided Between my six youngest sons mentioned
 above and to my four youngest Daughters Mary Isabella
 Ann and Peggy the Two Negro Men named Harriet Jack and Will
 and the Girl named Nell I will to be kept on the plantation
 for the Benefit and Support of my wife and Children unless
 any of them should prove unruly and in that case to be

Sold and the money arising from such sale to be applied
 for the same use as my two eldest sons Robert and William and
 my two Daughters Sally and Jemmy I give to each of
 them I will that my movable Estate consisting of horses cattle
 sheep Hogs &c household furniture &c to be valued & appraised
 and the said the appraisers of farming lands to be kept for the
 use of the plantation and that my son Robert and son in Law
 John Berry Shewby appoint the Executors of this my Last will and
 Testament in writing which I hereunto set my hand and
 seal this 21st day of Nov^r 1792

I Subscribed a further Devotions and addition to the above Last
 will as follows to wit. I will and ordain that the Land that I gave my six
 youngest sons as above named shall not come into their possession as a
 Right or Property therein until the age of Twenty one years of each of them
 and if any of the said Children should die or have no lawful issue
 before the said age of Twenty one that then their Part of said Land shall
 be Equally Divided amongst the Surviving Brothers I will and ordain
 further that if any of the said sons should die before his Part of said Land
 that my Executors shall Choose their honest and intended men of the
 Neighbourhood who shall Value said Land and then any of the
 said Brothers shall have the first offer for the Term of three Months
 at the appraisement of the said three men and upon their Refusal at
 the end of the three Months that then they may sell to whom they will Choose
 also will that my son in Law John Berry be set aside from being an Executor
 as above appointed and that my Beloved wife Nancy is hereby appointed
 to Live in her Room. I further will that all my lawful Debts be paid
 and Discharged in writing which I hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 29th day of Sept^r 1793.
