In the Name of God amen I William McClinton of the County of Bath and State of Virginia do make and constitute this my last will and Testament that is to say, I assign my soul to its Creator in all humble hopes of its future happiness and as to such worldly estate as it has placed God to bless me with I will and dispose of in manner following leaving it at the discretion of my executors hereafter named to have me buried in a decent and Christian manner, and after paying all my just debts and funeral expences my Estate to be disposed of in manner following to wit: Then it is my will and desire that my dearly beloved wife Nancy should remain on and have her living on the plantation I now live on during her natural life and as it is her desire that I should only leave her the following property saying that now would only be an incumbrance, I will that she shall have two Cows any that she may choose, her bed and furniture such as she may choose with any other of the household furniture that she may choose also her saddle and one horse be it which ever she may think proper and the same to be hers and at her disposal at her death in whatever manner she may think proper. Then I will the plantation whereon I now live to my son Alexander McClinton and to him his heirs and assigns forever and that he take possession of the same after my death and his mother to live with ^{him} Then I will to my Grand son William and McClinton (son of my deceased son William) the plantation whereon his mother now lives to him his heirs and assigns forever but should my said Grand son William die without Issue or before he arrives at the age of twenty one years in that case I will that his brother Moses McClinton should have the said plantation whereon his mother now lives and to him his heirs and assigns forever and should my Grand son Moses die without Issue or before he arrives at the age of twenty one years in that case the said land is willed to my son Alexander McClinton.

 Stand it is my will that after my wife has taken
 what I before wrote to her with my saddle and
 wearing apparel which I desire she will take
 that all the residue of my moveable property the
 goods and stock and every other species of move-
 able property to be sold and the money arising
 from such sale with all the bonds, notes or money
 due to me in anywise when collected be equally
 divided in the manner following that is to say to my
 son Joseph McClintic one part of the amount of such
 money to my son Robert one part to my son Alex-
 ander one part and to my daughter Margaret Mor-
 ris one part and to my daughter Nancy Michol-
 len one part except the amount of a bond taken from
 her and not on Stamp paper for forty pounds and
 to the children of Thomas Micholles which he has
 had by my daughter Jane now deceased I will
 one part of the amount of the sales & before mentioned
 to be equally divided between them and to be paid
 by my executors hereafter named, as the said children
 of my daughter Jane shall be of age or marry and
