In the name of God amen, I Martha Dickenson
being at this time of sound and perfect mind though weak
and frail in body do declare Ordain and constitute my last
will and testament to be as follows, wit. My soul I give
to God who gave it, my body I leave to be decently
buried by the sides of my dear husband John Dickenson
Now I give and bequeath unto Pety Dickenson wife
of Adam Dickenson my negro girl Phillis to her
and her heirs forever. Now I give and bequeath
unto my son John Dickenson my negro boy George to
him and his heirs forever also my negro boy Peter to
him and his heirs forever. I also give my negro woman
Betty to my son John Dickenson for the term of seven
years at the expiration of which term of seven years
P. Negro Betty with her increase from this date is
to be equally divided amongst all my children male and
female. Now I give and bequeath unto my Grandson
John Brown Dickenson my negro boy James to him
and to his heirs forever. Now I also give and bequeath
unto my Grand daughter, Pety Thornbury daughter
of Samuel Thornbury and Pety his wife my negro
girl Susan to her and her heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter name not
known. Present daughter of my daughter Jane to wit my
negro boy Andrew to her and her heirs forever. Now also
the stock of horses cattle hogs and sheep now in my possession
with all my household and kitchen furniture, two beds with
furniture excepted, which I give to my son John Dickenson
are to be equally divided between all my children male and
female. Now I also give unto my son Adam Dickenson my
two negroes Mary and Sam for the term of seven years at
the expiration of which term they are to be equally divided
among all my children male and female what ever just debts may be due from
my estate are to be paid out of the legacies left in proportion
to the amount of each legacy. And I do hereby Ordain
and constitute my son Adam Dickenson and my son John
Dickenson executors of this my last will and testament

In the name of God amen, I William Morris of the County of
Bath and State of Virginia do make and constitute this my
last will and testament that is to say, Insigning my last & last
will in humble hopes of its future happiness, and as to such
worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with I
will and dispose of in manner following leaving it at
the disposal of my executors hereafter named to have
me buried in a decent and Christian manner, and after
paying all just debts and funeral expenses my estate
is to be disposed of in manner following, to wit. Now I do

my will that the plantation I now live in should be sold giving a reasonable Credit. Now I will my larger man named Manuel should be sold after the first day of January next. Now it is my will that my wife and children should live in the plantation Speechard of my father estate and for to keep the residue of all my property and slaves while she remains a widow and then to be equally divided among them all. It is my will and I do appoint my brother Robert Morris executor of this my last will and Testament Reserving all that will be satisfied made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 11th day of February 1808.
