

KNOW all men by these presents that I James Ewing of Bath County and State of Virginia have made certain deeds constituted and appointed, and by these presents do make Ordain constitute and appoint Joshua Buckley of the County and State aforesaid my true and lawfull Attorney for me and in my name but to my use to ask, demand, sue for, recover, and receive, the sum of four hundred dollars due to me by Contract, from James Seeright of Augusta County and State aforesaid, and require that all legal means be used for the purpose aforesaid and do further require that my said Attorney do in my name and so my behalf convey to the said Seeright one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Randolph on the old field fork of Elk River containing five hundred acres being part of tract of one thousand Acres granted to the said Ewing under the Seal of the Commonwealth and dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of June 1791 and further to do and Execute all and every other lawfull act and act necessary for conveying the aforesaid tract of land to the said Seeright, his heirs, Executors admors or assigns and for recovering the aforesaid sum of four hundred Dollars, with the legal interest that may be due thereon, which shall be considered as if I were personally present hereby Ratifying and confirming what sever my said Attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be done in or about the premises.
