 receive their part when they may or come of age and each
 to have a proportionable part of the interest of the whole
 amount as they may stand in need of for Schooling or
 otherwise. 7th I give and bequeath to my sons James, Robert
 William, Samuel & Alexander Castile as before mentioned
 the plantation whereon I now live to be sold and the price
 thereof to be equally divided amongst them at the death
 or Marriage of my wife Nancy Castile, or if the death
 or Marriage of my said wife should take place before
 my youngest son arrives of the age of twenty one, the
 land not to be sold until that time, but left for the use
 and benefit of my Children until they are of age, I also
 give to my son James Castile one silver Watch and Rifle
 Gun, and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
 two sons John Castile and James Castile Executors of this
 my last will and testament hereby Revoking all other or
 former Wills by me heretofore made. In Testimony whereof

 leave to her, her heirs administrators or assigns likewise I
 leave to my beloved wife Elizabeth Peck one negro
 man named Lou and a woman named

 as my movable Estate, 1st I give and bequith to my son
 Anahabel Reech Dec^d two sons Mary Reech and John
 Reech one dollar to each of them to be then third of my
 estate 5th I give and bequith to my son John Reech one
 dollar to being his part share of my estate. 6th I give
 and bequith to each of his sons Robert Reech and Allen-
