the same again and as for my worldly Estate I Give Bequeath and
Bequeath the same in the following Manner and form First I
Bequeath to My son William Six Shillings and to My son John Six
Shillings and to My son James I Give and Bequeath My Eleventh
My Horse and Saddle and all other My Estate Except I Give
and Bequeath to My Daughter Anne one fifth Part also I Give
and Bequeath to My Daughter Margaret My other fifth Part
also I Give and Bequeath to My Daughter Lindsey Willey one
Dollar also Make and Bequeath My son James My Scholar
of this My Last Will and Testament and I do hereby Bequeath
all other Wills or Testaments and appoint this to be My Last
Will and Testament in Witness whereof These presents set my

and account for and pay the amount of the Public Taxes Impose
by Law within the said County of Bath for the year 1793 as the Law
Directs then the above Obligation to be void Else to Remain in force

for the express purpose of saying, affidavits, Twenty Thousand
Acres of Land in the State of Kentucky between Isaac Hill and My-
self agreeable to the writing given me by the said Hill for the
recovery of the said Land, and to convey in My Name One
half of the said Land unto the said Isaac Hill

To further empower, the said Joel Walker to sell One Thou-
sand Acres of the said Land & to Make a Title to the same
and to take all lawful ways & means in My Name to secure
a Title to the said Land & to Make the execution of the same with
