This Inventory and appraisement of the estate of William Tallman was made and returned to Court and ordered to be Recorded

Teta John L. Francis etc

I Robert Landy of the County of Bath and State of Virginia constituted this my last will and testament in the words following to wit that is to say.

1st. I will & bequeath to my beloved Wife Elizabeth one Negro Woman named Kate one horse called paddy three cows her choice and all the household & kitchen furniture and her maintenance on either of my Plantations during her lifetime

2nd I will to my eldest son Robert all my Land on the west side of the Bullpasture River of which I am aware of except such as is herein after mentioned one negro Boy named Ned and the slave & call the new claims.

3rd. I will to my youngest son George all the Land on the East side of the Bullpasture River which I am aware of

4th I will to my eldest daughter Nancy Sullivan her share of the Land exclusive of what she has already received.

5th I will to my second daughter Elizabeth one negro Woman named Fels and her child

6th I will to my third daughter Jane one negro Woman named Mary & child Phoby

7th I will to my fourth daughter Rachel one negro Boy named Bill and one girl named Milly.

8th. I will to my fifth daughter Margaret two hundred acres of Land it being an entry on the west side of the Land named to my eldest son Robert, one negro Boy named Ben and one negro Girl named Charlotte.

9th. One tract of Land of 500 Acres on the west side of the Bullpasture River it being also an entry together with all the Slaves horses cattle sheep dogs &c. not herein mentioned I will to be sold and after paying all my just debts & personal expenses to be equally divided among all my children And lastly I constitute and appoint my son Robert my executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 22nd day of July 1821.
