In the Name of god Amen. I William Wilson of Bath county  
and State of Virginia living aged and infirm; but of sound judg-  
ment and memory, calling to mind the Mortality of all Men do  
make and execute this my Last will and Testament revoking all  
former Wills & Testaments respecting my worldly Substance &  
constitute this my last in Manner following Wiz—  
Impress I begareth my Soul to give unto God in hope of an  
happy & glorious Immortality Through the Intercession of the Lord  
Jesus Christ & my body to the earth from whence it was taken  
in hope of a resurrection to a Spiritual and glorious Existence—  
This body to be buried in a Christian and decent manner—  
Item I will that all just debts & the expence of my funeral be  
discharged as to my worldly Goods I begareth my Manna  
following Wiz— I begareth to my daughter Susanna a certain  
Parcel of Land including my dwelling House and other  
Buildings & boundaries as followeth from the mouth of the Stony  
Run to the Center of the Road ~~the Gap~~ and up the same oppo-  
site where the Line of the Old Survey crosses it, and from thence  
all my Land to the west and South West, to her her Heirs  
& assigns forever. Item to my daughter Elizabeth from the  
mouth of the Stony Run up the same to the Head of the New  
and Old Survey and all North and east of this line both  
New and Old and from the last corner by the Gap down  
the old Run to the beginning, to her her Heirs & assigns  
for ever— Item to my daughter Barbara the Survey of  
Land containing the big Spring of Mineral Water, but  
if she should die said Survey within ten years after my  
death, shall give to each of her sister Susanna and  
Elizabeth Turkey pences arising from the sale of the Land  
this Survey to my daughter Barbara her Heirs & assigns for  
ever—

I give to my daughter Susanna a Negro woman named Phebe and a little child  
called Gul Noman & Selly with their free to her her Heirs & assigns forever  
Item to my daughter Elizabeth a Negro woman named Phebe & another a  
mulatto boy to her her Heirs & assigns forever I give to my daughter Barbara  
a mulatto woman Noman Selly with her freedom of passing to her her Heirs  
and assigns forever Item I leave my Negro man Jerry to my daughter  
Susanna to work for her so long as she shall live then shall he belong to  
Elizabeth and afterwards to Barbara to work for them so long as any of them  
shall live; but after the death of all the three they shall be a free man—  
Item I begareth to my son John five pounds to be paid when my Brother  
Stephen shall have accounted what he owes to my estate—  
Item to my daughter Margaret Green One Dollar I give to my grand  
daughter Jenny Green a Two year old Heifer I give to my grand son  
William Wilson a Two year old Heifer I give to my nephew William  
Wilson son of my Brother Stephen a Yearling Heifer Item to the poor of  
the County three pounds, to be divided to them by the Overseers of the  
poor I give to my daughter Susanna the Chest of Drawers and  
also the Corner Cupboard last for the Cupboard she shall allow her  
sister Elizabeth and Barbara each Twenty Shillings—  
I give whatsoever Stock I have Noman to my three daughters Susanna  
Elizabeth & Barbara also their Saddle Bids Furniture and Cash over  
to them and whatever I have hitherto given to them by these presents  
equally and conjointly to them. Item every thing not yet mentioned or  
left a certainty I leave to my three daughters Susanna Elizabeth  
and Barbara to them their Heirs & assigns forever—  
I appoint my son John Wilson & daughter Susanna executors of this my  
last will and Testament and the Revd. William Wilson to  
be their overseer and guardian of the Heirs—  
I will that there be no appraisement of my estate but the  
the overseer among my three daughters shall be accounting  
to the judgment of the executors as equally as they can make em-  
ployments in those things not clearly ascertained by these  
presentes and in the sale of an Land in the same or some other  
place and a money sum Sept. the Eleventh signed sealed and acknow-

for the purpose of cutting with and purchasing of Thomas

and the said Thomas Lynn Lewis hath this day Searched  
the said Commissioners on an acre of Land to inclose the Build-  
ings before mentioned for the purpose of erecting a Court  
House to be built for which the said George Page John Brown  
and Jacob Warren Commissioners in behalf of the said County  
will jointly agree to pay unto the said Thomas Lynn Lewis  
the sum of one hundred Dollars whereon a note shall be  
executed & Recored agreeable to this instrument of writing  
in consideration whereof the said Thomas Lynn Lewis doth  
humbly oblig himself his Heirs Executors and Administrators  
to make access in free simple to said quantity of land as  
aforesaid the fourteenth day of April next ensuing in the  
month of April hundred Dollars the said Thomas Lynn Lewis  
doth further agree under the obligations above mentioned that  
he will give free privilege to the person appointed to build  
the Court House to collect Stone & Cut Timber for the building  
thereof between the stream that runs into the Valley at Thomas  
Lewis and that impounding at the San Yards to their Successors  
& that no written waste should be made or come by the said
