This Last will and Testament of William Wilson of Bath County was proved by witnesses this and came to be Recorded

In the Name of god Amen. I William Wilson of Bath county and State of Virginia being aged and infirm, but of Sound Judgment and Memory, calling to mind the Mortality of all Men as made and again this my last will and Testament revoking all former wills & Testaments respecting my worldly Substances & constitute this my last in Manner following Viz
I Impresly bequeath my Soul to god who I have believed in hopes of a happy & glorious Immortality through the Merit of the Lord Jesus Christ & my body to the earth from whence it was taken in hopes of a resurrection to a Spiritual and glorious Existence -
This body to be buried in a Christian and decent manner -
I am I will that all just debts & the Expence of my funeral be discharged - As to my worldly Goods I bequeath in Manner following Viz - I bequeath to my daughter Susanna a certain Parcel of Land including my dwelling House and other Buildings & bosom as follows from the mouth of the Spring up the water as far as the Head of the Spring and from the mouth of the Spring down to the Center of the West line of the same and up the same line to where the line of the Old Survey crosses it, and from thence all my Land to the west and South West, to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever. Item to my daughter Elizabeth from the mouth of the Spring down the same to the Head of the New and Old Survey, and all North and east of this line both New and Old - and from the Last Corner by the Gap down the West Side to the beginning, to her, her Heirs & Assigns for ever - Item to my daughter Barbara the Survey of Land containing the big Spring of Mineral Water, but if she should live said Survey within Ten years after my decease, shall give to each of her sisters Susanna and Elizabeth Twenty pounds arising from the Sale of said Land - This Survey to my daughter Barbara her Heirs & Assigns for ever -

Item to my daughter Susanna a Negro woman named Phebe and a little white Girl named Sally with their issue to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever - Item to my daughter Elizabeth a Negro woman named Pats & her issue to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever - Item to my daughter Barbara a Negro boy to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever - Item to my daughter Barbara a Negro woman named Sally with her issue forever to her, her Heirs & Assigns forever - Item I leave my Negro man Jerry to my daughter Susanna to work for her so long as she shall desire then shall he belong to Elizabeth and afterwards to Barbara to work for them so long as any of them shall desire; but after the death of all the three Jerry shall be a free man - Item I bequeath to my son John five pounds to be paid when my Brother Stephen shall have advanced what he owes to my estate - Item to my daughter Margaret Green one Dollar - Item to my grand daughter Jerry Green a Two year old Heifer - Item to my Grand Son William Wilson a Two year old Heifer - Item to my Nephew William Wilson son of my Brother Stephen a Yearling Heifer - Item to the poor of the County three pounds, to be advanced to them by the Overseers of the poor - Item to my daughter Susanna the Chest of Drawers and also the Corner Cupboard best for the Cupboard she shall allow her Sister Elizabeth and Barbara each Twenty Shillings - Item I leave a Stock of Hens named to my three daughters Susanna Elizabeth & Barbara also then several Beds Furniture and Cash and to them - and whatever I have hitherto given to them by these presents really and confessor to them. Item every thing not yet mentioned or clearly ascertained I leave to my three daughters Susanna Elizabeth & Barbara to them their Heirs & Assigns forever - I Appoint my son John Wilson & daughter Susanna Executors of this my last will and Testament - and the Rev. William Wilson to be their Counselor and guardian of the Heirs - I will that there be no appraisement of my estate but the the divide among my three daughters shall be according to the Fragment of the Act, as equally as they can make convenient, in those things not clearly ascertained by these presents and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety four Sept. the Eleventh signed sealed and Authored -

Such that whereas the Court of Bath County hath appointed
George Page John Brown & Jacob Warlick Esq. Commissioners
for the purpose of settling with and purchasing of Thomas
Lynn Lewis one acre of Land so as to include the said new
line & the other improvements made by Valentine White Man
said Land to be appropriated to the use of the County aforesaid
and the said Thomas Lynn Lewis hath this day solemnly
the said Commissioners one acre of Land to include the Build-
ings before mentioned for the purpose of settling a Court
House & thereon for which the said George Page John Brown
and Jacob Warlick Commissioners in behalf of the said County
with him by agree to pay unto the said Thomas Lynn Lewis
the sum of one hundred Dollars when a deed shall be
executed & recorded agreeable to the instrument of writing
in consideration whereof the said Thomas Lynn Lewis doth
truly oblige himself his heirs Executors and administrators
to make deed in fee simple for said quantity of Land at
or before the fourth day of April next ensuing in the pe-
nalty of Two hundred Dollars the said Thomas Lynn Lewis
has further agree unto the Obligations above mentioned that
he will give free privilege to the persons appointed to locate
the Court House to collect Stone & Lumber for the building
thereof between the stream that runs into the Valley at Thomas
Bevers and that impinging at the Tan Yard to the sources
& that no wooden waste should be made or come by the s^d
stream In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
