Know all men by these presents that we Robert Sittlington William Sittlington Samuel Blackburne John Brown and John Sittlington are held and firmly bound unto James Pleasants Jun^r Governor of Virginia and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth in the sum of thirty thousand dollars to which payment will and truly to be made by him ourselves our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally jointly by these presents sealed with our Seals and dated this 12th day of August 1823

The condition of the above obligation is such That whereas the above bound Robert Sittlington is constituted and appointed Sheriff of Bath County by commission from the Governor under the Seal of the Commonwealth dated the 19th day of July 1823. If therefore the said Robert Sittlington shall well and truly collect all Taxes and upon Rates and accounts for and pay the same in such manner as is by Law directed and also all fines forfeitures and amercements accruing or becoming due to the Commonwealth in the said County and shall duly account for and pay the same to the Treasurer of this Commonwealth for the time being for the use of the Commonwealth in like manner as is or shall be directed in case of public Taxes and shall in all other things truly and faithfully execute the said Office of Sheriff during his continuance therein then the above obligation to be void otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
