Provided Nevertheless that if my Grand Daughter Nancy Seftwiche within Ninety should Depart this life without an heir Lawfully begotten of her body that the with (Name) (big) Farm & her increase shall revert to my children to be divided amongst them in the same manner that the rest of my Estate is Divided.
