and give her the negroes to her & her heirs forever named Thompson, Hooker,
& Efford her inheritance & lastly I give to my three sons Collins, William & Charles
the Practice of Law & the waters of Penna Creek & the County to be
equally divided between them also the Land & now lying on after the Death
or marriage of my wife to be equally divided between my three sons
I give to my two daughters Betty & Mary the Practice of Law for
life & to my son William a part of Meriwethers and
to the same to be equally divided between them & lastly I give my dear & beloved
wife & other necessary expenses, & the Land which I now live on in case my wife
Death or marriage to be retained for the said purpose & for the benefit of my
Children & lastly All the rest of my Estate both real & personal of what na-
ture or kind a matter it may be not herein before particularly specified of David

being legally divided among my several children hereinafter named
 subject to them their heirs Executors Administrators & assigns forever; &
 Lastly I solemnly constituted & appointed my friends Thomas Johnson and
 Joseph Roughton Executors of this my last Will & Testament. In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 15th Day of April
 One thousand eight hundred & ninety

A Court held for Bedford County at the Courthouse the 28th Day of August
 1819 in this Last Will & Testament of David Johnson Dec^d was exhibited
 in Court by Thomas Johnson one of the Exors therein named, & proven by the
 solemn affirmation of William Ballard one of the subscribing Witnesses in
 And a Court held for said County the 25th Day of September 1809 this
 Last Will & Testament of David Johnson Dec^d was further proven by the oath
 of Samuel Hobbs & by the solemn affirmations of Benjamin Johnson the other
 subscribing witnesses & ordered to be recorded, & on the motion of the said
 Thomas Johnson one of the Exors therein named who made an oath, together
 with Benjamin Hobbs & William Ballard jointly his several, entered into &
 acknowledged their bond in the sum of two thousand Dollars conditioned
 as the said writ, Certificate is granted with power for obtaining a probate there of
 in due form, liberty being granted the other Exors to oppose the probate thereof
 whenever he shall think fit.
