whole estate, personal and real to Frances Davis during her  
 natural life and my will and desire is Frances Davis's Son  
 Edward Davis shall have sufficient Maintenance and Schooling  
 out of the Profits of my Estate and if the said Edward Davis should  
 live to the Age of eighteen Years or marries then I give my whole  
 Estate to him, Real and Personal to him and his Heirs forever  
 and my Will is that he shall have liberty to Will my whole estate  
 Real and Personal if he should die before he arrives to the  
 Age of Twenty one Years, and my will and desire is that if  
 Edward Davis should die before he arrives to the Age of eighteen  
 Years then I give to my Brother Richard Gouldman all the  
 Land that I had of my Mother to him and his Heirs  
 forever. I'll M I give to my Brother Robert Gouldman all  
 the Land that I purchased of John Andrews to him and  
 his Heirs forever, I'll M I give to my Brother Francis Gouldman  
 one Negroe Boy named Ben to him and his Heirs forever.  
 I'll M I give to Charles Donohoe one Negro Boy named Will  
 to him and his Heirs forever. I'll M I give to Samuel  
 Davis's daughter Sally Davis one Negro Girl named Lett  
 to her and her Heirs forever. I'll M I give to Samuel

to her and her Heirs forever - I then I give to Samuel  
Davis's Daughter Clary Davis one negro Girl named Ester  
to her <sup>her</sup> and her heirs forever - I then I give one negro woman  
named Phillis to my Brother Thomas Gouldman's Daughter  
Mary Gouldman to her and her Heirs forever and my  
will and desire is that the Remainder of my Estate that is  
not already given and mentioned shall be sold to  
discharge all my Just Debts, I give unto Clark Davis  
and all my wearing apparel and one pair of silver shoes  
and Knee Buckles and one pair of Gold sleeve Buttons and  
one Silver band Buckle. I then I hereby appoint Frances  
Davis, Samuel Davis and Thomas Gouldman Executors to  
this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand  
and Seal this thirteenth day of October One thousand

At a Court held for Bedford County December 26<sup>th</sup> 1774.  
The within last Will and Testament of Edward  
Gouldman Deceased was proved by the Oaths of John Sutton  
and John Andrews two of the Witnesses thereto Subscribed  
and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of Thomas  
Gouldman one of the Executors therein named who made  
Oath thereto Probate is granted him in due form giving  
Security whereupon he together with Francis Thorp James  
Buford, Cornelius Noell and Thomas Vance his Securities  
entered into and Acknowledged their Bond in the Penalty  
of two Thousand Pounds for the said Executors due and  
faithfull Administration of the said Decedents Estate and  
Performance of his Will. Liberty being reserved the other  
Executors in the said Will mentioned to join in the Probate  
thereof when they shall think fit. To which Probate  
Richard Allen by his Attorney came into Court and objected

and John Andrews two of the Witnesses thereto Subscribed  
and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of Thomas  
Gouldman one of the Executors therein named who made  
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Security whereupon he together with Francis Thorp James  
Buford, Cornelius Noell and Thomas Vance his Securities
