 Will & Testament in form & Manner following first I declare
 unto my Brothers Humphrey & Robert all Claims or
 Demands Which I may hereafter have against them or
 either of them for any Sum or Sums of Money Owed
 by them or either of them as heretofore Slaves also I Release
 my Brother Humphrey for any Claim or Demand
 for any Sum or Sums of Money Owed by him to my
 Aunt as Executor to the Estate of my Father Stern
 I do give unto my said Brothers Humphrey and Robert
 & their respective heirs all the Monogable Egyptian & other
 Modicae & other former Currencies for money received

Mordica Booth my former Guardian for money received
as they would to be equally divided between them

Item I give and bequeath unto Callahall Morris One
Negro Man named Ben to him & his heirs forever

Item I devise unto Wm. P. Shotton one negro girl
named Lucy in trust for the use of my son Callahall

Morris & her heirs forever Item I devise unto my sister

Lucy Brooke one negro Boy slave named Sam
to her & her heirs &c. Item I devise unto Andrew James

One Slave named William Shotton upon trust that

the said Andrew Shotton will hire the said Slave to
the best advantage and will deliver & convey unto my

Niece Ann Talliferro as soon as she shall attain the age

of twenty one years or lawful marriage, the said Slave

(female) together with the hire which may be received

been caused for them and that in case the said Ann
shall die before she becomes of age or married that
the said Ann shall pay the said slave pay the
hereinafter mentioned my sister Lucy Brooke her
husband John I desire into William P. Killen who
intermarried with my sister Ann a bond to my brother
William Brooke the remainder of my slaves to be equally
divided between them and it is my express intention
that the aforesaid residue to my Brothers is not to be
indivisible to either any sales or sales of any of my
slaves as I want to see my former country persons to see
any of them and if any are sold I include them in the
same to William P. Killen and my Brother Mr
and sister John Constant California Thomas P. William
P. Killen my Executors to this my last will and
Testament hereby giving and granting Vaidal former

Wills by me heretofore made To wit
have been set my hand & seal this twenty eighth

day of February 1809

their bond in the penalty of \$1500 pounds Conditions
for the said Executors due faithful administration of
said Decedent's Estate & Performance of her Will
Liberty being reserved Colwell Morris the other
Executors in & Will to have the Protest thereof
When he shall think fit
