I, Matthew Williams of the County of Bedford being of sound mind and memory but weak as
to body health do certify this my last Will and Testament
It is my desire my body should be decently interred at the discretion
of my Executors whom I hereafter appoint, and as to my worldly
goods I dispose of them in manner following: I give and bequeath
my just Debts are paid which are but few. It is my desire that
all my Estate be kept together the next ensuing Year, I then I lend
to my Wife Jane Williams during her natural life my Plantation
whereon I now live except the parts in possession of my Sons John
and Peter Williams. I also lend her all my Household and
Kitchen furniture Plantation utensils &c. also four Negroes to wit
Annady, Nancy, Leahy & Peter also my two Grey Cows & Stock of
Buttle & Hogs except two cows and calves and one Sow & Pigs
I give to my Son John Williams all the lower part of my
Tract of Land whereon I now live divided by a line to be hereafter
run beginning thirty yards below my Peach Orchard fence on John
Williams line and to run North West towards to Charles's old line
thence and his heirs forever. I then I give to my Son Peter
Williams all the remainder of my said Tract of Land from said
line and upwards after the death of his Mother also two cows
& calves and one Sow & Pigs to him & his heirs forever
I give to my Son William John Wadon the Tract of

Land he now lives on to him & his heirs forever
 This my Will I desire that all my Estate not already
 mentioned be at the end of the next Year equally divided
 between my four Children to wit, William Hopkins John
 Hopkins Paine Hopkins & Martha Wadden
 This my Will I desire also that my undivided part of an
 Entry of Land in Partnership with W. J. Walker & Christopher
 Clark be equally divided between my said four Children
 also all the property of all kinds except Land which
 I lend to my Wife after her Death
 It is my desire that Isaac Oley, William Seftwick Junr &
 W. J. Walker be my Executors & Witnesses my hand and
 Seal this 21st day of Feb^r 1807 One Thousand eight hundred &
