Provided she Remain in this County and after her Decease
that said Negroes and their Issue take the Property of my Daughter
Betty Callaway Here I give and Bequeath to my Daughter

arrive at the age of Thirty One Years Also a Negro Boy named

Estates and out of the money arising from such Sales I

Order that all my Just Debts be paid and two feather

Beds be Purchased and as many utensils for
farming with what Household furniture

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I shall necessary for my Wife to Carry on the Farming Business
on the Plantation Aforesaid. Also Order that out of the
money Aforesaid any Exrs. Build a Dwelling House
and what Other Houses they shall think necessary on the
Land Aforesaid for my Wife and Child to live in.
Lastly I constitute and appoint Francis Thorpe
William Callaway Esq. and Charles Gualkind Exrs.
of this my Last Will and Testament and I do hereby
Authorise my said Exrs. or any two of them to make
Conveyances to the Purchasers of my said Aforesaid
and in Case any of them should die before such con-
veyances are made I Order that the Surviving Ones Execute
the same. And I do hereby Ratify and Confirm this
and no other to be my Last Will and Testament. In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this 15th Day of Novr. 1772.

into and Acknowledged their Bonds in the Penalty of One
Thousand Pounds for the Said Executors due and faithful
Administration of the Said Decedents Estate and Performance
of his Will. Liberty being Reserved to the other Executor named
in the Said Will to Join in the Probate thereof when he shall
think fit
